The 39 Steps Opens At Wabash

If you're tired of being cooped-up because of COVID and just want to spend two hours laughing hysterically, get tickets for the Wabash Theater Department's production of *The 39 Steps*, which opens February 23 and runs through 26 with performances at 8 p.m. each evening.

Tickets are free and can be reserved through the Fine Arts Center Box Office.

The 39 Steps is a zippy, rollicking adaptation of Alfred Hitchcock's serious 1935 film

that weaves in plenty of wit and whimsy, fast-paced action, and lots of laughs. Unlike Hitchcock's movie, which featured dozens of actors, the stage version squeezes the cast down to four.

Rob Johansen, who has appeared on stage and backstage, is the play's visiting director. He was last seen on stage in *Biloxi Blues*, and has also taught workshops on movement and stage combat and choreography, but in real life he plays a professional actor working across the

Midwest.

"Wabash wanted me to teach to my strengths: comedy, farce, and physical comedy," Johansen told *The Bachelor*. "And we thought this play would be a great vehicle for those things... It's very physical. It's very rigorous. And I think it's phenomenal training for an actor."

The Civil Rights Acts of 1964 might be something of a miracle even with the dynamism of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., and the energy of Rev. Ralph Abernathy and the Southern Leadership Conference. Making law out of the Dream, required... wait for it, lobbyists.

Yes, those oft-faceless lobbyists in polished oxfords, clacking through the tiled halls of Congress, glad-handing the powerbrokers. Indeed, those folks we ordinarily love to suspect of buying votes or leveraging unfair access.

"We have a tendency to hide

or ignore the challenges of the groups working together," said Dr. Shamira Gelbman who will present on the extraordinary alliance of lobby organizations in her talk for the last Sunday of Black History Month. The fifty-plus organizations that first formed the Leadership Conference on Civil Rights in the 1950s worked loosely toward the same goals. By the 1960s, getting almost ninety organizations to cooperate and coordinate as one of the most "impressive lobbying campaigns of the 20th Century" took a catalyst, some big personalities, and a shared goal, honed by pragmatism and a touch of rivalry.

The Leadership Conference began with "classic" civil rights organizations like the NAACP, the SCLC (Southern Christian Leadership Conference) and many lobbying organizations including UAW and other labor unions, professional organizations, Cath-

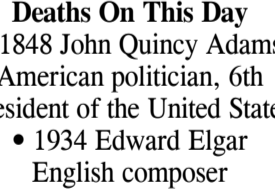

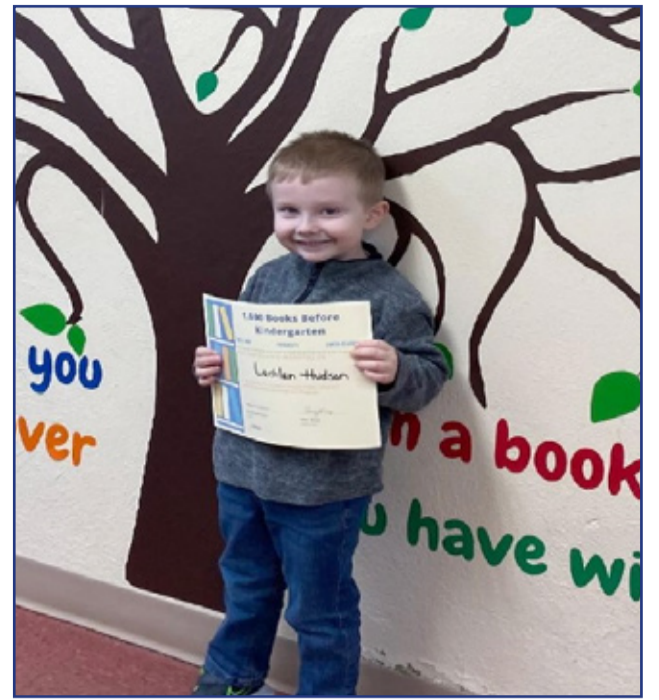

Indiana Donor Network Has Partnered With Medigo To Improve Organ Transportation

Indiana Donor Network has partnered with a national logistics and communications company to technologically enhance how organ donations are transported locally, regionally and nationally.

Baltimore-based MediGO provides cutting-edge tracking capabilities and critical data collection throughout the transport process to predict an accurate time of arrival at a hospital or transplant center. In real time, the platform informs Indiana Donor Network of changes to a delivery's timeline so all involved in the transport and transplant process can better manage resources and improve chances of successful organ and tissue transplantation.

When Indiana Donor Network prepares organs and tissue for transport, information is populated into the MediGO platform, giving everyone involved access to critical information about the delivery. The information, available via a web application, includes GPS tracking, traffic and weather conditions, best and alternative travel routes, delays and more. The system also provides real-time map updates.

"MediGO's platform significantly enhances our ability to know where an organ is at all times and get real-time updates to transplant center staff. This improves communication among teams, results in better organ recipient outcomes and ultimately helps us save more lives,"



said Sherry Quire, director of organ services at Indiana Donor Network.

Indiana Donor Network currently utilizes 15 MediGO tracking devices to monitor organs in transit throughout the state.

Indiana Donor Network joins a growing list of organ procurement organizations to innovate tracking and communication during organ shipments.

"The success of human organ transplants is measured in seconds and minutes, and every person and vehicle involved in moving these organs is an added layer of risk standing between a lifesaving surgery," said Scott Plank, co-founder and CEO, MediGO. "The MediGO OPO Delivery Management platform manages this complex chain of custody and complex mode of transportation for urgent medical cargo. We are proud to partner with the Indiana Donor Network to make an impact on improving healthcare outcomes."

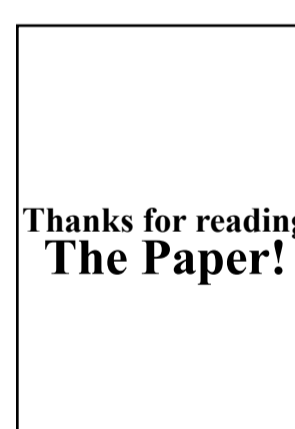

provide all the space for the actors to channel their talents into exaggerated movements. Logan Weilbaker, coming off his performance in the lead role of Gregory in last fall's production of The Amateurs, stars as Richard Hannay, a run-of-the-mill guy living a pretty boring life until he meets Anabella, who claims she is a spy who has uncovered important military secrets. When she ends up dead - in Hannay's house - a hilarious manhunt begins from London to the Scottish Highlands. Emilie Prince stars as Anabella Smith, while also playing two other women entangled by Hannay, Margaret and Pamela as he attempts to clear his name and uncover the spy network.

Prince, a junior at DePauw majoring in English writing and Chinese, is making her Wabash stage debut. The truly heavy lifting is done by Drew Johannes and Luke Fincher, known in the program as "Clown 1" and "Clown 2," but the audience will see them in dozens of roles as the fast-moving comedy picks up speed. The stage version of The 39 Steps ran on Broadway for over 770 performances, and won the Olivier Award for Best Comedy and Tony Awards for lighting and sound. olic and Protestant organizations, the National Jewish Community Relations Board, the Japanese League among others unified as the Leadership Conference. The miracle, or at least breakthrough, was getting them to work together on a day-to-day basis, to share office space, hire dedicated staff, hold weekly meetings, divide work, publish newsletters and mobilize grassroots campaigns. Roy Wilkins of the NAACP and Walter Ruther of the UAW, both central to the Leadership Conference, recognized the catalyst: John F. Kennedy, who had introduced the legislation and for the first time, staked his political survival on achieving its passage. The study of this uncommon year of cooperation and collaboration fascinated Dr. Gelbman,

who wrote her recent book after researching the lobbying and legislative process that brought about the Civil Rights Act of 1964. Dr. Gelbman grew up in Brooklyn, NY, in a diverse neighborhood that co-existed but rarely interacted. Gelbman witnessed the Crown Heights Riots while she was a teenager and began wondering what brings groups into conflict, then into cooperation and coalition. She "geeked out" as she learned the untold story of the lobbyists, some from small organizations without big money, men and women who committed themselves to change for the downtrodden and unwealthy interests of ordinary Americans. Accompanying Dr. Gelbman's talk will be a talk by local historian Vicke Swathmore Hudson

Swisher about the Civil Rights Era in Montgomery County. They will present at Bethel AME Church on February 27 at 7 pm. This year is the 175th anniversary for Bethel AME, which is not only an active congregation but is also registered as National Historic Place. Everyone is invited. The event is sponsored by Humans United for Equality, the Malcolm X Institute, League of Women Voters, and the Carnegie Museum.
