New Innovative Ivy Tech Meets Students Where They Are

Ivy Tech's presence has grown from a twice-a-week night class in the 1980's, held in a Crawfordsville School classroom, to the beautiful facility and campus established in 2013 on Phil Ward Blvd.

As a higher educational institution, a community college is like no other in mission and services it is asked to provide. It is accountable to its community. At a recent Economic Health meeting of the League of Women Voters Montgomery County, Kristin Oakes, site director for the Montgomery County

Instructional Site, described its rich curriculum and variety of services through which it works to reach our population.

Give Blood In Honor Of World Blood Donor Day

Each year on June 14, the American Red Cross joins blood collection organizations around the world to celebrate World Blood Donor Day, which recognizes the importance of a safe and stable blood supply and the donors who make it possible. Nearly 2.5 million people volunteer to give lifesaving blood and platelets every year with the Red Cross. Eligible donors are encouraged to be part of something big by making an appointment to give blood or platelets this month.

Blood donations decline in late spring and early summer – especially during holiday weeks, like Memorial Day and Independence Day – but the need for blood and platelet transfusions doesn't take a summer break. Generous blood donors are critically important in ensuring lifesaving care is available the moment patients need it. To schedule an appointment to donate, download the Red Cross Blood Donor App, visit RedCrossBlood.org or call 1-800-RED CROSS (1-800-733-2767).

Health insights for donors

At a time when health information has never

been more important, the Red Cross is screening all blood, platelet and plasma donations from self-identified African American donors for the sickle cell trait. This additional screening will provide Black donors with an additional health insight and help the Red Cross identify compatible blood types more quickly to help patients with sickle cell disease. Blood transfusion is an essential treatment for those with sickle cell disease, and blood donations from individuals of the same race, ethnicity and blood type have a unique ability to help patients fighting sickle cell disease.

Donors can expect to receive sickle cell trait screening results, if applicable, within one to two weeks through the Red Cross Blood Donor App and the online donor portal at RedCrossBlood.org.

Blood drive safety
 The Red Cross follows a high standard of safety and infection control. The Red Cross will continue to socially distance wherever possible at blood drives, donation centers and facilities. While donors are no longer required to wear a face mask, individuals may choose to continue to wear a mask for any reason. The Red Cross will also adhere to more stringent face mask requirements per state and/or local guidance, or at the request of blood drive sponsors. Donors are asked to schedule an appointment prior to arriving at a drive.

How to donate blood
 Simply download the American Red Cross Blood Donor App, visit

RedCrossBlood.org, call 1-800-RED CROSS (1-800-733-2767) or enable the Blood Donor Skill on any Alexa Echo device to make an appointment or for more information. All blood types are needed to ensure a reliable supply for patients. A blood donor card or driver's license or two other forms of identification are required at check-in. Individuals who are 17 years of age in most states (16 with parental consent where allowed by state law), weigh at least 110 pounds and are in generally good health may be eligible to donate blood. High school students and other donors 18 years of age and younger also have to meet certain height and weight requirements.

Blood and platelet donors can save time at their next donation by using RapidPass® to complete their pre-donation reading and health

history questionnaire online, on the day of their donation, before arriving at the blood drive. To get started, follow the instructions at RedCrossBlood.org/RapidPass or use the Blood Donor App.

He liked computers and anime. He loved to ride his bicycle around Broad Ripple, where he lived. He loved animals, especially his cat North, which he was very fond of.

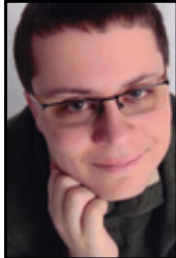
He was a sweet, gentle soul taken too soon.

• A work year of 240 days with annual allotment of (staff/student days out of

• Long-Term Disability Insurance – As with other administrators, the
Superintendent is eligible to be covered by the school corporation’s long-term

• Teachers Retirement Fund (TRF) – The school corporation pays 100% of the

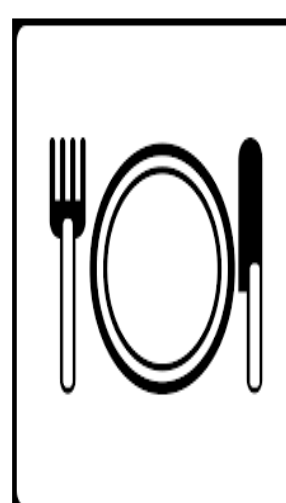
