



under the leadership of Helen Hudson, who has served as president and co-president since 2019. As the centennial of the ratification approached in 2019, members of the League cajoled Hudson into taking on the role. Since Hudson began overseeing Indiana's second largest League, she's stamped the League's work with her energy and passion. She brings together citizens in the bi-partisan work that distinguishes the League. In addition to annual member roles such as participating in the observer corps – members attend government board meetings both learning how they work and reporting observations to fellow members- she has invited members to join study committees such as education, health, climate, economic health and housing that align with their concerns. Furthermore, Hudson has made Women's Equality Day and Centennial celebrations extraordinary. During her first year of leadership, the League spearheaded a spectacular celebration of the centennial of women's right to vote with choral singing of suffragists' songs, a gathering of 300
