My wife and I shopped at the Wal-Mart on State Road 26 East in Lafayette a couple of weeks ago . . . needed to pick up a few odds and ends. It was a cloudy, cold, and windy day, and we were bundled up in our winter coats. As we approached the entrance, I noticed a fellow who appeared to be in his 30s, pushing a cart full of groceries out the front door. He was

wearing a short-sleeve T-shirt, shorts, and flip-flops. Seriously. And once inside, in front of us was a teenage girl in shorts and a tank top!

Strange? No, this is a fairly common occurrence. The temperature inside the store, at my best guess, was around 60 degrees. My hands were cold as I pushed the cart around, yet I saw several little kids with no coats. As a youngster, my folks insisted I dress warmly during the winter months... heavy coat, hat, and gloves. All of my classmates did the same . . . no questions asked. Yes, yes . . . I know . . . it's a different world that we live in now. I grew up in the 1950s and early 1960s. People had more common sense, and we did what our parents told us to do . . . no questions asked. In addition, peer pressure to conform was the standard. That

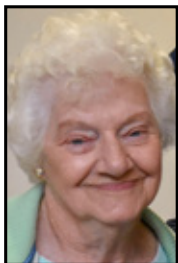

Wabash College's Benjamin Bullock 2023 Named Yenching Scholar

Wabash College student Benjamin Bullock '23 was named a Yenching Scholar, a prestigious and highly competitive international fellowship.

A native of Stourbridge, England, Bullock earned the two-year fellowship from the Yen-Ching Academy of Peking University in Beijing, China, which brings together young scholars who have demonstrated a talent for leadership and innovation. During his two-year award, Bullock will pursue a master's degree in China Studies, following the Academy's history and archaeology pathway, while his thesis will focus on the Chinese Trotskyists and the Underground Labor Movement from 1929-32.

Bullock is the first Wabash student to be named a Yen-Ching Scholar. There are 120 chosen per year from around the world, with 80% being non-Chinese, 30% coming from Europe, and an overall selection rate of 2-3% of applicants.

"I have had my eyes on studying in China since freshman year, but the pandemic kept putting those plans on hold," said Bullock. "So, finally to be able to study in China, and to do it at an institution as prestigious as Peking University, is the best

possible reward for the hard work and patience. I am super excited to attend such an internationally minded school with people who share the same commitment as I do to learning more about China."

He is a history and humanities double major with an emphasis in Asian Studies and a minor in music. Currently, Bullock is the sports editor of The Bachelor, the College's student newspaper. He handled play-by-play commentary for the soccer team's livestreams, serves as a consultant in the Wabash Writing Center, and is a member of the Wabash Glee Club.

He studied the Russian language in Vladivostok, Russia, and Bishkek, Kyrgyzstan, in the Spring of 2022. That summer, Bullock studied in Latvia through the G. Michael Dill '71 Fund.

"The Yen-Ching Scholarship is a great oppor-

tunity and a wonderful match for Ben," said Susan Albrecht, Wabash College fellowship advisor. "The program allows him to complete research which fascinates him, advance his Chinese language proficiency, and connect with other young scholars and leaders from around the world."

"Ben may be the most promising undergraduate student I have taught," said Stephen Morillo, professor of history. "He is outstandingly self-driven and motivated, showing so much initiative and ability to work on his own. Ben created his own major and in pursuit of that major spent a semester abroad in Russia and Kyrgyzstan, where he thrived, showing levels of adaptability

and perseverance most couldn't manage."

Bullock is among the many Wabash men who have earned highly competitive fellowships in the last decade, including a Rhodes Scholar, a Marshall Scholar, an Obama Voyager Scholar, 25 Gilman Scholars, and 26 Fulbright recipients.

"The Yen-Ching would give me the opportunity not only to study in China but also to quench my intellectual thirst at the intersection of Chinese history, language, culture, and China's interactions with the wider world," said Bullock. "No doubt, the professors and archives at Peking University will help propel my history research to the next level. I'll see where that takes me."

Lt. Gov. Crouch, IHCD Announce Affordable Housing Investment

Lieutenant Governor Suzanne Crouch and the Indiana Housing and Community Development Authority (IHCD) Board of Directors recently announced the recipients of the 2023 Low Income Housing Tax Credit (LIHTC) program, which is used to incentivize private developers to fund the construction, acquisition and rehabilitation of affordable housing communities throughout Indiana.

More than \$180 million in housing tax credits were awarded to 17 developments to create or preserve 776 affordable units that will serve individuals, families, seniors, individuals with disabilities and individuals experiencing homelessness. The tax credits will be claimed over 10 years.

"These low income housing tax credits represent a significant commitment to our state's infrastructure," said Lt. Gov. Suzanne Crouch, who also serves as Indiana's Secretary of Agriculture and Rural Development. "The selected developments will directly address the needs of our workforce and will bring hundreds of affordable housing units to Indiana cities, towns, and rural areas."

IHCD received 33 LIHTC applications requesting 2023 credits under the 2023-2024 Qualified Allocation Plan (QAP). The QAP, which is unique to each authorizing state, details selection criteria and application requirements for the LIHTC program, Multifamily Bonds, HOME funds, Development Fund and the National Housing Trust Fund in conjunction with tax credits. It also contains all deadlines, application fees, restrictions, standards and requirements.

"IHCD administers the LIHTC program to create and preserve affordable housing in the state," said IHCD Executive Director Jacob Sipe. "The scope of today's awards will make a lasting impact on thousands of

Hoosiers, providing necessary affordable housing developments to communities around the state for at least the next 30 years."

IHCD incentivizes developments that will be in proximity and accessible to desirable facilities tailored to the needs of the tenants, including access to services, retail, health-care and transit. IHCD prioritizes developments that will be in communities with nearby access to employment, access to post-secondary education and access to primary care. All 17 developments earned points in this category by demonstrating proximity to or location in these areas.

Seven of the 17 developments will meet IHCD's commitment to individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities by providing affordable housing in an integrated setting. These developments will create up to 82 units for this population.

Developers will create 53 units of supportive housing for persons experiencing homelessness by utilizing the Housing First model. Four of the 17 developments completed training through the Indiana Supportive Housing Institute and will help rapidly house individuals experiencing homelessness and provide intensive but flexible services.

Three of the developments will preserve 116 units of existing affordable housing, ensuring they remain affordable for at least 30 years.

Constructing affordable housing within a diverse array of Hoosier communities remains a priority. Six of the developments will be created in large cities, seven in small cities, and four in rural communities.

In addition to LIHTC funding, the board also approved \$10.3 million in Development Fund loans, \$1.5 million in HOME loans, and \$6.2 million from the Housing Trust Fund.

Should We Be Concerned About A Nuclear War?

I spent my first 10 years living in Michigan City, which is 35 nautical miles from Chicago. I was a Cold War kid. Our bogeyman was Soviet General Secretary Nikita Khrushchev, who made a lasting impression when he took off his shoe at the United Nations, hammering the podium while threatening to "bury" the U.S.

At Edgewood Elementary School, we practiced nuclear drills (along with fire drills). Downtown Michigan City had "fallout shelters" marked with yellow and black signs. After the 1962 Cuban Missile Crisis, my father, Jack Howey, who was city editor of the News-Dispatch, didn't betray his emotions to the family, but later described several sleepless nights during that 13-day crisis. I remember my first grade teacher telling us that President Kennedy was going to address the nation. She had a worried look on her face.

I conjure these events and images because here in 2023, we find ourselves once again on the nuclear straight-razor. Last week, former Russian president Dmitry Medvedev, a top ally of President Putin who now serves as deputy chairman of the Security

Council, posted on Telegram: "It never occurs to any of the lowlifes to draw an elementary conclusion from this: The defeat of a nuclear power in a conventional war can trigger a nuclear war. Nuclear powers have not lost major conflicts on which their fate depended."

That is just one in a continuum of reckless nuclear saber-rattling from the Putin regime as it flounders in its war with Ukraine, a conflict it picked and is now losing. The Guardian reported that the Kremlin is now deploying Pantsir defensive missile intercept systems around Moscow and near Putin's dacha.

The Daily Beast reported that Ukrainian authorities are now saying that Russia's biggest cities are bound to suffer attacks. "Internal escalation of the war in Russia is inevitable," said Mykhailo Podolyak, an adviser to the Ukrainian president, told The Daily Beast.

This past week, President Biden, German Chancellor Olaf Scholz and NATO have agreed to send Abrams and Leopard 2 tanks to Ukraine. The German Leopards will be delivered in a couple of months, in time for an expected Spring offensive that could determine the fate of this brutal war. These tanks have the ability to do what the first key advocate of the tank during World War I - First Lord of the Admiralty Winston Churchill - envisioned, which is to break across, trench "no man's land."

This past week, the Bulletin of the Atomic Scientists announced that its 2023 Doomsday Clock

has been set forward to the closest to catastrophe it has ever been, just 90 seconds before midnight.

The horrific war in Ukraine "has increased the risk of nuclear weapons use, raised the specter of biological and chemical weapons use, hamstrung the world's response to climate change, and hampered international efforts to deal with other global concerns," the Bulletin stated. "Russia's thinly veiled threats to use nuclear weapons remind the world that escalation of the conflict — by accident, intention, or miscalculation — is a terrible risk. The possibility that the conflict could spin out of anyone's control remains high."

"No one can do this alone, but everyone can do something," said the Bulletin's President and CEO Rachel Bronson. "We hope that the moving of the clock is a motivator that we all need to pay attention to these key issues."

Eric Schlosser, author of "Command and Control: Nuclear Weapons, the Damascus Accident, and the Illusion of Safety and Fast Food Nation" writes in The Atlantic: "Several scenarios for how Russia might soon use a nuclear weapon seem possible: (1) a detonation over the Black Sea, causing no casualties but demonstrating a resolve to cross the nuclear threshold and signaling that worse may come, (2) a decapitation strike against the Ukrainian leadership, attempting to kill President Volodymyr Zelensky and his advisers in their underground bunkers, (3) a nuclear assault on a Ukrainian military target, perhaps an

air base or a supply depot, that is not intended to harm civilians, and (4) the destruction of a Ukrainian city, causing mass civilian casualties and creating terror to precipitate a swift surrender — the same aims that motivated the nuclear attacks on Hiroshima and Nagasaki."

"Any response by the Biden administration would be based not only on how Russia uses a nuclear weapon against Ukraine but also, more important, on how Russia's future behavior might be affected by the American response," Schlosser adds. "Vladimir Putin can determine if, when, and where a nuclear attack occurs in Ukraine. But he cannot control what happens after that. The consequences of that choice, the series of events that would soon unfold, are unknowable. One thing is clear, after all my discussions with experts in the field: We must be ready for hard decisions, with uncertain outcomes, that nobody should ever have to make."

Should we be losing sleep over this reckless rhetoric of the despot Putin and Dmitry Medvedev as this war worsens?

Well, perhaps.

This is not a situation for overt panic, but reasonable concern. It means having discussions with your family, friends and co-workers about what to do, where to go, and how to communicate should such a crisis develop.
