Nucor Pumps \$400M, 80 **New Jobs Into Community**

The sky overhead was dismal and gray in stark contrast to the bright sunshine and warmth emanating all over southeastern Montgomery County Friday morning.

Just off Nucor Road, at the home of Nucor Steel's local facility, Indiana Gov. Eric Holcomb, Crawfordsville Mayor Todd Barton and County Commissioner President John Frey gathered with Nucor executives and team members to break ground on a \$400 million expansion that will create 80 high-paying jobs

"These are great careers, these aren't just jobs," Holcomb told an assembled crowed of approximately 200. "Indiana is the No. 1 steel-producing state in America,' Holcomb said. "Thank you (Nucor) for putting us in that position."

Nucor plans to invest \$290 million in the expansion and modernization of its sheet mill operations at the Crawfordsville plant. This means adding a construction grade continuous galvanizing line and prepaint line to its operations. The galvanizing line will have a capacity of 300,000 tons per year, and the prepaint line will have an annual capacity of 250,000 tons. The upgraded production capabilities will further expand Nucor's existing operations across North America.

Holcomb was quick to give credit to the local community leaders, as well as Nucor corporate, for making this project a reality.

"This is a pretty special team here," Holcomb said in reference to Nucor officials,

Frey and Barton. "Someone like Mayor Barton gets it and leads the way," Holcomb added later. "I would call him a global leader. And how lucky is Nucor to have a partner like Commissioner Frey. (This news today is) an amount that's literally felt and heard around the world."

Nucor's Dan Needham, an executive vice president at corporate headquarters and former local general manager, said none of the expansion would be possible with the team in Montgomery County. He explained that \$290 million would go toward the 80 new jobs and that the remaining \$110 million goes toward capital improvements.

"I know this," he told the crowd. "A strong community creates a strong business environment."

Frey agreed. "This is a huge day for Montgomery County," he said. "Montgomery County has a national spotlight on us today. We have created the environment here that people, businesses and industry want to be a part of. Job creation is always the goal of local leaders, but job retention is even more important. Keeping our best employers in our community is paramount. This \$400 million investment assures that Nucor is not going anywhere."

Barton was the final speaker and quoted from the book American Steel by Richard Preston, talking about the bare square mile of Montgomery County farm ground that eventually grew into the local giant that Nucor is today.

"It's impossible to imagine this community without Nucor today," Barton said. "We celebrate Nucor's continued commitment and their unmatched corporate leadership."

Giving Every County In District 23 An **Economic Engine**

Are we making the right decisions as a state to use our land in ways that will maximize economic growth and minimize food insecurity? A bill I sponsored would create a land use task force to study food insecurity in both rural and urban areas, as well as growth trends across Indiana. It passed the Senate unanimously Monday.

I believe every county in District 23 deserves an economic engine of its own. My hope in getting behind this legislation is that it will lead to concrete actions that will spark economic growth in all of District 23, but especially in Fountain, Warren, Vermillion and Parke counties.

House Enrolled Act 1132 would establish a 13-member task force with six legislators and seven members appointed by the governor representing industries such as residential construction and agriculture.

Recommendations to help communities attract development in the future would be reported to the Committee on Legislative Council by July 1, 2024.

The legislation now heads to the governor's desk for consideration.

Increasing High Speed Internet Access

I compare the need for rural broadband to the need for rural electricity a century ago. It's just as essential for economic growth and daily life. As a new State Senator, I am just getting started in working on this issue, but I wanted to pass on that the Indiana Office of Community and Rural Affairs has started the Indiana Connectivity Program, which helps fund projects to expand broadband access throughout the state.

The state announced Wednesday that it has awarded \$842,000 in funding to spread broadband internet to

206 households and 10 businesses in Indiana. Unfortunately, District 23 was only a small recipient with four locations in Tippecanoe County for \$19,200 and one address in Parke County for

One way you can assist is to help create a better map of the areas in most need of connectivity and to challenge false assertions that your address has broadband when in fact it doesn't. Please visit this link from the Purdue Center for Regional Development to learn how to do so. If you have connectivity but know someone who doesn't, please help them through this process so that their address can be confirmed as one in need.

Working on a Budget The state's budget is a work in progress and there are still a few priorities I would like to see adjusted, but Senate leadership released their budget proposal this week. The proposed Senate budget is balanced and includes historic funding for K-12 education. It also would increase salaries for Indiana State Police and pay down our long-term pension obligations.

Budget highlights include the following:

- \$3.1 billion to the Pre-1996 Teachers' Retirement Fund, which, when fully funded, will free up \$2 billion in the state's biennial budget
- \$2.5 billion in new money for K-12 education, including \$1.1 billion in new tuition support and eliminating textbook fees for all families
- \$95 million to increase pay for State Police, conservation and
- excise officers • \$500 million to help local communities with capital projects
- \$225 million to create an optional local public health grant that counties can use to improve public health services, and \$35 million to expand the state's mental health infrastructure and support
- \$75 million to help local communities invest in housing development

Property Tax Payment Deadline Approaching

Property tax bills are mailed one time each year and should be arriving in the mail. They include payment coupons for the spring and fall due dates. The final day to pay spring taxes without penalty is May 10, 2023. If you choose to only pay the spring taxes at this time, please hold onto your fall payment coupon to use this fall.

Some taxpayers are noticing a higher bill, which could be due to a few different factors including assessed values, tax rates, and tax deductions. The Indiana form TS-1A on page 2 of the tax bill shows a twoyear comparison of taxes and will indicate where the increase is occurring. Taxpayers can also research their parcels and current balances at www. beacon.schneidercorp com or www.montgomerycounty.in.gov.

You are entitled by law to receive a tax statement, even if the balance is zero or a mortgage company has marked your parcel "in escrow" and plans to pay it for you. If your taxes are zero or if your mortgage company is paying on

your behalf, you do not need to send anything to the Treasurer's Office.

Payment Options: • Pay at the office. The Treasurer's Office is located in the Montgomery County Government Center and is open Monday-Friday from 8 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. at 1580 Constitution Row. Please be aware that beginning April 17 there will be road construction on Constitution Row lasting approximately two weeks. Please allow for

extra time, as that road

could be reduced to one-

lane traffic. • Use a Drop Box. A secure drop box is located on the south side of the County Government Center under the awning and is checked multiple times daily. We encourage the use of checks for this box. When using the drop box, please put payments in an envelope and mark them clearly with information to identify the taxpayer, the address, and the parcel. Your canceled check will serve as a receipt or you can include a self-addressed, stamped envelope to receive a returned receipt. Confirmation of payment history is available to view online for your parcel at www.beacon. schneidercorp.com.

• Mail Payments. Please mail payments to the Treasurer's Office at 1580 Constitution Row, Suite B, Crawfordsville, IN 47933. If a receipt is desired, please include a self-addressed, stamped envelope.

• Pay at Local Banks. All Montgomery County First Financial, Hoosier Heartland, and Tri-County branches offer a great service to our county residents by accepting payments during the tax season. This is in effect now through the due date as long as you have the payment coupon and pay that exact amount. The drive through service is available. You will receive a receipt from the bank. Pay Online. The county website is www. montgomerycounty.in-.gov. On the home page, select Online Bill Pay. Next choose the Property Tax, Dog Taxes & Tax Payments option. Multiple parcels and dog taxes can be paid in the same transaction. Please be aware that using any

type of debit or credit card will accrue a 2.95% service fee. Using bank routing numbers instead for an e-check payment has only a .95 charge.

• Pay by Phone. By using the secure access line of (855) 276-8051, taxpayers can make payments over the phone by entering the parcel number. Service fees apply.

Gov. Holcomb, INDOT Award More Than \$133 Million **Through Community Crossings Grant Program**

Governor Eric J. Holcomb and the Indiana Department of Transportation (INDOT) announces 224 Indiana cities, towns, and counties that will receive a combined \$133.4 million in state matching funds for local road projects through Community Crossings, a component of Governor Holcomb's Next Level Roads program.

"The continued success of the Community Crossings program becomes more evident each year," said Gov.



Holcomb. "Improving transportation infrastructure at the most local level makes communities that much more attractive for business and Hoosier families alike to connect and grow. Communities submitted

applications for funding during a highly competitive call for projects in January. Applications were evaluated based on need and current conditions, as well as impacts to safety and economic development. Funding for Community Crossings comes from the state's local road and bridge



matching grant fund. The **Community Crossings** initiative has provided more than \$1.27 billion in state matching funds for local construction projects since 2016. "Safe, modern infra-

structure at the local level makes Indiana's transportation network stronger," said INDOT Commissioner Mike Smith. "Partnering with locals on these projects is something INDOT looks forward to each year. The hard work and dedication of local entities to secure these funds and make improvements in their communities does not go unnoticed."

To qualify for funding,

local governments must provide local matching funds of 50 percent for larger communities or 25 percent for smaller communities and have an asset management plan for maintaining existing roads and bridges. Indiana law requires annually that 50 percent of the available matching funds be awarded to communities located in counties with a population of 50,000 or fewer.

State lawmakers identified long-term funding for Community Crossings as part of House Enrolled Act 1002, passed by the legislature and signed into law by Gov. Holcomb in April 2017.
