Ask Rusty – What If I Delay But Die Before Claiming Social Security?

Dear Rusty: Hypothetically, if I plan to sign up for Social Security at 70 and pass away before that, I will get nothing. My spouse would still get a boost in the amount she receives because I made more, but everything I put into the program vanishes. I haven't reached my full retirement age yet and I still have income, but if I sign up now at 63 my benefits will be withheld due to my income. Then at full retirement age (presuming I elected to claim earlier) a re-calculation will take place and my monthly amount would be adjusted. Well, what happens if I decide to wait until 70 but pass away before I claim? Are my contributions repaid in a lump sum, or will I (or someone else) still lose everything? Signed: Uncertain About My Future

Dear Uncertain: You are correct that if you pass away before collecting your earned Social Security benefits you won't personally get anything.

Social Security has, since inception, been a "pay as you go" program where those currently working and contributing to Social Security pay benefits for those currently receiving Social Security. That means that if you die before collecting, the monies you contributed will have already been used to pay other recipients, but the contributions you made may still entitle your dependents to benefits on your record. For those who are in their early 60s, average longevity is mid-80s, meaning your spouse would likely collect benefits on your record for more than two decades, any minor children could collect until they are adults, and any permanently disabled

child you may have would get benefits from your record for the rest of their life as well.

The Social Security payroll taxes you contributed were not put into a private account in your name. And, on average, it is to the beneficiary's advantage the program doesn't work that way because that personal account would be depleted fairly quickly after you claim - rather than getting benefits for the rest of your life, you'd only get benefits (plus interest) from your personal account, which would run dry pretty fast. FYI, we have researched this very carefully and found that, on average, all payroll taxes contributed to Social Se-

Mark Levin: The Nation Cannot Take Eight Years Of 'This Marxist Stuff'

Special counsel John Durham received bipartisan support when he was selected four years ago to investigate wrong doing on the part of the FBI and Hillary Clinton's 2016 presidential election campaign. Durham's report, released a few weeks ago, revealed that the FBI and the Clinton campaign sought to prove Donald Trump's campaign had ties with Russia. "In effect, the FBI was working with the Democrat Party and Clinton" to undermine President Trump, according to Mark Levin, host of a syndicated radio show and the weekly Fox News Life, Liberty and Levin show. He recently joined Rebecca Weber, CEO of the Association of Mature American Citizens, on her AMAC Better For America podcast.

Levin said that Andrew George McCabe who served as the Deputy Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation back then was leaking alleged findings to the media and then he would use those leaks to get FISA warrants. It was "the most egregious violation of the

faith of the American people that I have ever seen." He said they wanted to destroy Donald Trump. "They should have been indicted for obstruction ... and brought in front of a grand jury. But that didn't happen and it's not going to happen. Part of the problem we have, and I've discussed this with individuals on Capitol Hill, is we've got to get these big Washington cases out of Washington because the grand juries are 95% Democrat. You can't get the kind of grand jurors and juries that you need -- a jury of peers. And so, when they control the Department of Justice, the FBI and the U.S. attorney's office. It's very, very hard to take them on."

Levin went on to point out that America's leftist elements have institutionalized political fraud. "We have states where there's no voter ID, no signature requirements, no date requirements. And then they say it's the cleanest election in American history. That's just not true. What they do is to take the fraud element and

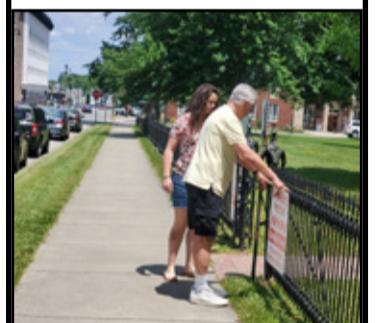
Gifts To Elevate Dad's Morning Routine This Father's Day

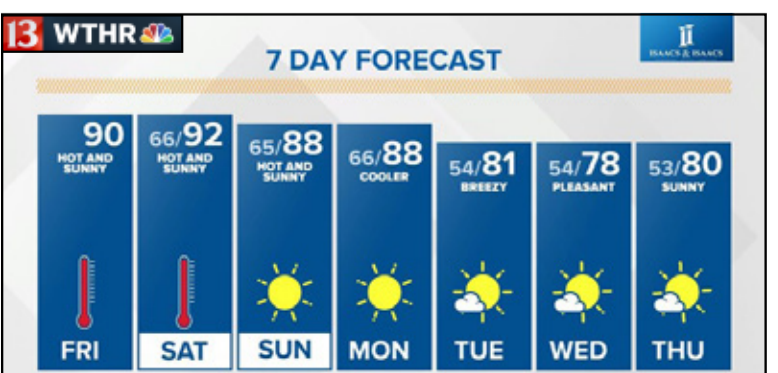

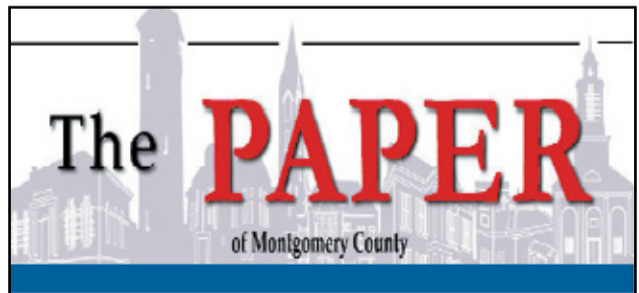

Record Funding For Schools And More

Partnering with parents to educate and prepare the next generation of Hoosiers is one of the most important

obligations of state government.

Our new state budget, which invests a historic \$2.9 billion in new K-12 funding, reflects this fact. The new money includes a \$1.5 billion increase in student funding, 62% of which will go toward teacher pay and benefits.

The budget also: Eliminates textbook and technology fees for Hoosier families with children in public schools, saving families up to \$160 million per year. (As a father to three students in public schools, I am particularly excited about this one!)

Provides an additional \$11 million for Secured School Safety Grants to ensure Hoosier schools are kept safe and secure.

Expands eligibility for Indiana's Choice Scholarship program. I consider myself a strong supporter of public schools because those are the schools that most families choose, but even the best public school will not be the right fit for every child in a community. I want parents to make those decisions based on education issues rather than financial ones. This expansion does just that by allowing every child to attend the school that best fits his or her unique learning needs.

Providing great educational opportunities is critical to our state's long-term success, which is why I was happy to support these funding increases in our new state budget. To learn more, click here.

Going forward, we need to do more to support high-quality early childhood education in our state. In fact, I met with leaders in Parke County today to discuss just that, and I look forward to more conversations with other leaders around the district

legalize it, then you can run around and say it's the cleanest election in American history. Why do they want to have voter harvesting? That is, after the votes are done, their people go out to nursing homes or they go out to homeless shelters and they quote-unquote, collect ballots. They are destroying the sanctity of the vote. They're destroying the franchise. They know they are. Our borders are wide open. People are coming in illegally. You don't have to prove who you are you don't have to sign your name. You don't have to do any of these things. In fact, in a lot of these cities people who are not here legally can actually vote in local elections. How are you going to prevent them from voting in federal elections? So, I don't buy this stuff that these elections are clean. And also, when you have the institutionalization of an unconstitutional decision like state courts or federal courts or a governor or a secretary of state or any-

body of that sort, changing election laws that affect presidential and vice presidential elections, it's utterly unconstitutional."

The future of our country will be decided in the 2024 elections, he said, noting that if the left wins in the next election cycle, we'll be in a very, very difficult place. The nation cannot take eight years of "this Marxist stuff. What if they succeed in expanding the Supreme Court or getting rid of the filibuster? If anything, it should make people more concerned, more fired up. We need our Thomas Paine out there to spread the word. They have the media, but we have the numbers. We have an army of millions of patriots. Just remember, the revolution was basically supported by one third of the colonists. We don't need everybody, but we do need a lot. And there are tens of millions who agree with us. And if they act, we will be able to push back. But it's going to be tough. So we've got to get started now."

curity by an individual will be recovered within about 5 years of starting benefits. The actual length of time to recoup one's contributions varies somewhat depending on lifetime earnings and contributions made, but lower earning beneficiaries will recover everything contributed through payroll taxes within about 3 years, while it could take as much as 5 years for higher earners to get back everything they've paid into the program. And for clarity, since self-employed individuals pay both the employee and employer portion of the payroll tax, it does take longer for those who own their own business to recoup what they've contributed. Nevertheless, on average, most who

claim benefits will get considerably more from the program than they paid in Social Security payroll taxes.

As to your specific question, if you die before collecting, the contributions you made weren't deposited in a personal account for you and won't be paid out in a lump sum. Rather, the payroll taxes you paid while working were used to pay benefits to beneficiaries receiving at the time, and those working and contributing after you die will fund the benefits paid to your spouse or disabled adult child until they die, or to your minor children until they are adults. The Social Security benefits you earned aren't just for you - your eligible dependents will also benefit from your record.

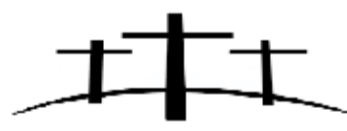

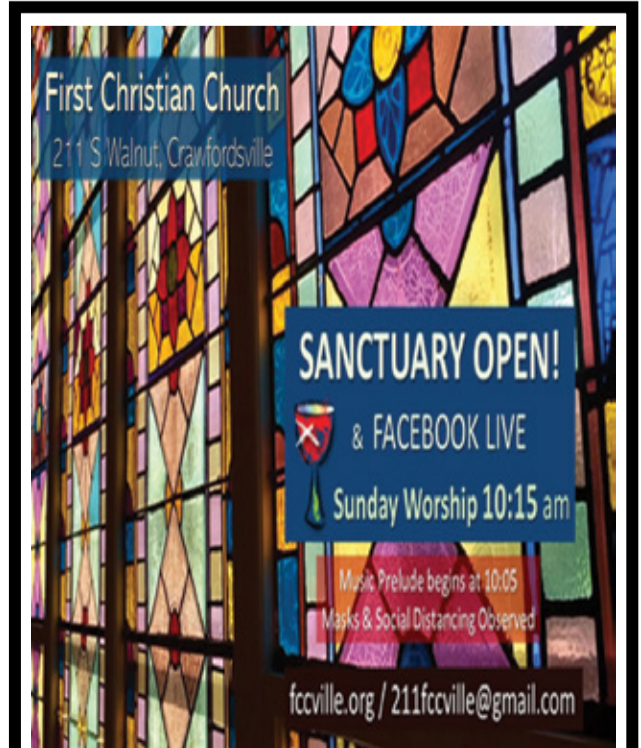
