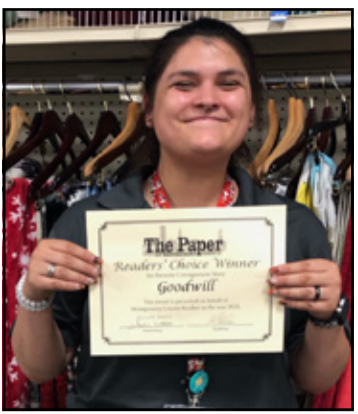

➔ THREE THINGS You Should Know:

1 The online platform created by the Indiana Department of Insurance (IDOI) for reporting cybersecurity events is now live. The new online form was created as a result of the Indiana Insurance Data Security Law that went into effect on July 1, 2021. The Indiana Insurance Data Security Law requires insurers and other entities licensed by the IDOI to develop, implement, and maintain an information security program, investigate any cybersecurity events, and notify the IDOI of such events. The law also established the IDOI as the regulatory body to receive, monitor, and enforce cybersecurity events involving licensed insurers and entities under Indiana Code Title 27

2 A growing number of Russian cyberattacks have targeted businesses, schools and federal agencies in the U.S. Torres-Arias says these attacks are on the rise due to the complexity of the software being targeted. He says that the software used in U.S. infrastructure does not follow the same quality standards that other critical services are held to, such as food and medicine. The Department of Defense is putting pressure on software producers to be more transparent about what is inside their products. Many of these hacks stem from software operators and service providers not knowing the specifics of what is in their infrastructure, making it harder to determine what the problem is during an attack. Torres-Arias says that it is nearly impossible to create hackproof software. Because of this, he believes better processes and tools need to be developed to minimize damage when cyberattacks happen.

3 Mahmoudian says deep-sea exploration is advancing, but more resources are needed for more reliable systems. She says remote-operated vehicles need better autonomy for safer exploration, something her research focuses on. Mahmoudian says there is progress in sensors and computation, but there needs to be better progress in decision-making algorithms. Mahmoudian says that despite the OceanGate mission, it is still important to explore the deep ocean. She says it should not discourage efforts to explore and visit the ocean floor.

Boomer Bits

Ask Rusty – Working Widow Seeks To Maximize Social Security Benefits

Dear Rusty: I was widowed years ago and, when I approached age 60, I looked into Social Security survivor benefits based on my late husband's record. He started receiving Social Security shortly before he died at \$1,200 per month. My income at age 60 was \$42,000 and, since Social Security would keep \$1 for every \$2 above the limit (around \$15,000 at that time), I did not apply. Next year I will reach my full retirement age of 66½, but I plan to work until I am 70. Will I be able to receive full survivor benefits next year if I continue to work? I plan to switch to my own Social Security benefit at age 70, which will be higher than my husband received. Since I am waiting to apply for survivor benefits, will there be an increase in the amount I receive? I am a municipal employee and when I retire, I will collect from the state retirement system. I paid into the state retirement system and also paid Social Security taxes, so will my state pension have any impact on my Social Security? Signed: Still Working

Dear Still Working: Congratulations on having an excellent strategy for maximizing your survivor benefit as well as your personal SS retirement benefit. Once you reach your full retirement age (FRA) next year, you are no longer subject to Social Security's "earnings test" and can collect Social Security benefits without those benefits being affected by your work earnings. Your surviving spouse benefit will be more because you are waiting until your full retirement age to claim it. At your FRA you can claim your full survivor benefit from your deceased husband (without reduction) and collect only that while still allowing your personal SS retirement benefit to grow to maximum when you are 70.

Then, at age 70, you can switch from your smaller survivor benefit to your maximum SS retirement benefit and collect that higher amount for the rest of your life. Essentially, your survivor benefit reaches maximum at your FRA and your personal SS retirement benefit reaches maximum at age 70. Note that you should apply for your benefits a couple of months before you wish them to start. For example, if you reach your FRA in May of next year you can apply for your survivor benefit in February or March, specifying that you wish your survivor benefit to begin in May 2024 at your full retirement age. Just be sure to emphasize that you are applying only for your survivor benefit

Double Check Text Messages For Scams

Indiana Attorney General Todd Rokita warns Hoosiers to avoid text message scams. If you are receiving a lot of scams via text, don't worry – you're not alone. "Today's world revolves around our phones, and scammers know it," Rokita said. "Hoosiers can protect themselves by being vigilant and knowing the signs when they receive fishy texts." Scammers know people are busy raising families, working and enjoying their hobbies. They are always hoping that you're not paying attention to that text or tweet that may look like it's from a family member or colleague, but it is actually from a fraudster. With the increased use of artificial intelligence or "AI", the communications and methods being used are becoming increasingly harder to detect. So, how do you make sure you are avoiding being scammed? The Rokita's office offers these few tips:

- If you think a text might be a scam, contact the company using a phone number or website you know is real.
 - Blocking or using restricted phone settings is an easy way to stop spam text messages.
 - Don't share any personal information over text. This is not a secure method of communication, and legitimate services won't ask for personal information through text messages.
 - Put a freeze on your credit to prevent new accounts from being opened in your name in the event of a breach.
 - Don't respond to spam texts. This allows scammers to know your account is active.
 - Report text scams. Forward them to 7726 (SPAM). This helps your wireless provider spot and block similar messages.
- If you believe you have been the victim of a scam, file a complaint at www.indiana-consumer.com with Rokita's office.

Dates and the specific roads to be Chip and Sealed.

Chip Seal Operations Starting On Or After July 5

The Indiana Department of Transportation announces a chip seal operation on U.S. 136 starting on or after July 5, weather permitting. Crews will be chip sealing from approximately 0.02 miles west of State Road 25 to approximately 1.1 miles west of U.S. 231 through July 6, weather permitting. After completion of the chip seal operation, crews will begin the fog seal operation which will last approximately two days, weather permitting. Once completed, crews will move on to the following roads in Montgomery County:

- State Road 32 - Lane restrictions from U.S. 41 to S.R. 25 (July 10 - 11, weather permitting)

- State Road 47 - Full closure from S.R. 234 to S.R. 32 (July 12 - 13, weather permitting)

- U.S. 41 - Full closure from S.R. 163 to approximately 0.63 miles south of U.S. 36 (July 17 - 18, weather permitting)

Crews will place message boards at each end of the project, to alert the traveling public. INDOT suggests finding alternative routes during the short duration of the chip sealing operation.

Work is completed under lane closures with flagging, or a full closure, to prevent damage to both vehicles and the roadway. During operations, existing pavement is coated with liquid asphalt, which

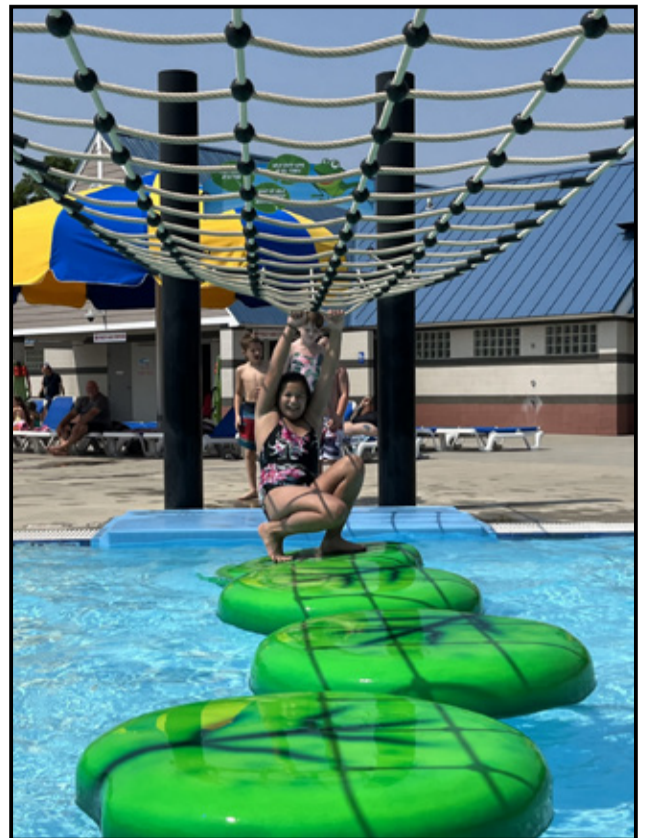
seals cracks and provides waterproof protection. This extends the service life of the roadway and lowers maintenance costs. Once the seal coat is complete, loose aggregate is applied and swept from the road. After a curing period, crews will return to fog seal the new driving surface and apply pavement markings.

INDOT makes every effort to reduce vehicle damage during and immediately after chip seal projects. While these efforts may not prevent all damage to vehicles during the chip seal process, they have substantially reduced the likelihood of damage.

INDOT safety efforts include posting reduced speeds in work zones; closing roadways or lanes during chip seal projects; and sweeping the roadway during the chip seal process and after project completion to eliminate loose stones.

Chip seal is a cost-effective pavement preservation technique that is utilized across the state of Indiana, saving an estimated six to 14 dollars in taxpayer expenditures for every dollar invested in extending the life of a roadway.

Motorists should slow down, watch for stopped traffic and drive distraction-free through all work zones. All work is weather dependent and schedules are subject to change.

Montgomery, Tippecanoe and Warren Counties
Awarded Crisis Response Funding

The Indiana Family and Social Services Administration recently awarded \$19 million to local organizations and governments around the state to help fight substance use disorders.

The Tippecanoe Regional Opioid Settlement Community Committee was awarded \$550,000, Recovery Coalition in Montgomery County was awarded \$326,500 and the Warren County Circuit Court will receive \$164,978.

The causes of drug addiction are multifaceted, but more attention to rehabilitation continues to be one of our best responses to assist those battling substance use disorder.

Explore Indiana

This week kicked off the official summer season, which means more traveling and time outside. Tourism is big player in our Hoosier economy already, but I support initiatives to make it even more central. Thousands of jobs are at stake.

In our new state budget, the General Assembly allocated \$10 million for direct flights, \$30 million to support Next Level Trails,

and funded major investments to further develop state park infrastructure.

I also supported a new law that offers foster families and foster youth free admission to Indiana Department of Natural Resources properties, including state parks and recreational areas.

There are many opportunities to explore our great state, from the beaches of Lake Michigan to the hills in Southern Indiana and the award-winning state parks in between. As your state senator, I will continue to support tourism initiatives and to make investments in our quality of living.

Applications Open Soon for Next Level Trails

The Indiana Department of Natural Resources will begin accepting Next Level Trails Round 4 applications July 1.

The program helps local governments develop and connect trails throughout Indiana. Since 2018, more than 190 trail miles have been constructed in 49 counties.

Applications close on Aug. 1.

Upcoming Road Work On 231 and Other Roads Rescheduled

The Indiana Department of Transportation announces restrictions on U.S. 231 starting on or after Wednesday, July 5 near West Lafayette for bridge maintenance. The road will be restricted down to one lane between U.S. 52 and W. 500 N. Traffic will be controlled by temporary traffic signals through July 8, weather permitting.

Then, on or after Sunday, July 9, U.S. 231 will be restricted to one lane between W. 625 S. and W. 500 S. for bridge maintenance near Lafayette. Traffic will be controlled by temporary traffic signals through mid-July, weather permitting.

Finally, U.S. 231 will be restricted on or after Friday, July 14 for bridge maintenance near Crawfordsville. It will be restricted to one lane

between E. 400 S. and E. 450 S. through the end of July, weather permitting.

This contract was awarded to Pacific Painting Co. and involves maintenance on six bridges. It involves two bridges in Fountain County on U.S. 41, one bridge in Montgomery County on State Road 32, and three bridges on U.S. 231 in both Tippecanoe and Montgomery County. Crews will be performing polymeric overlays to provide additional years of service to the bridges. The entire contract is expected to be completed in October of 2023, weather permitting.

The Indiana Department of Transportation announces State Road 75 will close on or after Wednesday, July 5 over Muskrat Creek, near Dover. Crews will be performing bridge work.

The road will be closed between S.R. 32 and County Road 200 N. through mid-August, weather permitting.

USDA Reminds Indiana Producers To File Crop Acreage Reports

Agricultural producers in Indiana who have not yet completed their crop acreage reports after planting should make an appointment with their U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) service center before the applicable deadline.

"Many USDA programs require producers to file an accurate crop acreage report by the applicable deadline," said Julia A. Wickard, State Executive Director in Indiana. "Once planting is complete, call your local FSA office to make an appointment to report your acreage. Our FSA staff can assist producers in completing acreage reports, including providing maps."

An acreage report documents a crop grown on a farm and its intended uses. Filing an accurate and timely acreage report for all crops and land uses, including failed acreage and prevented planted acreage, can prevent the loss of benefits.

How to File a Report
The upcoming acreage reporting dates are applicable in Indiana:
• July 5 - Prevented Planting Claim for Soybeans
• July 15 - All Other Crops including forage

crops and Conservation Reserve Program acreage.

•Cucumber acreage reporting dates vary by county and planting date. Contact your local FSA office for a list of acreage reporting deadlines for cucumbers.

To file a crop acreage report, producers need to provide:

- Crop and crop type or variety;
- Intended use of the crop;
- Number of acres of the crop;
- Map with approximate boundaries for the crop;
- Planting date(s);
- Planting pattern, when applicable;
- Producer shares;
- Irrigation practice(s);
- Acreage prevented from planting, when applicable;
- Other information as required.

Acreage Reporting Exceptions

The following exceptions apply to acreage reporting dates:

- If the crop has not been planted by the acreage reporting date, then the acreage must be reported no later than 15 calendar days after planting is completed.
- If a producer acquires additional acreage after the acreage reporting date,

then the acreage must be reported no later than 30 calendar days after purchase or acquiring the lease. Appropriate documentation must be provided to the county office.

•Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program (NAP) policy holders should note that the acreage reporting date for NAP-covered crops is the earlier of the dates listed above or 15 calendar days before grazing or harvesting of the crop begins.

Producers should also report crop acreage they intended to plant, but due to natural disaster, were unable to because of a natural disaster.

Prevented planting acreage must be reported on form CCC-576, Notice of Loss, no later than 15 calendar days after the final planting date as established by FSA and USDA's Risk Management Agency.

FSA offers continuous certification for perennial forage. This means after perennial forage is reported once and the producer elects continuous certification, the certification remains in effect until a change is made. Check with FSA at the local USDA Service Center for more information on continuous certification.

Farmers.gov Portal

Producers can access their FSA farm records, maps and common land units through the farmers.gov portal. Through a new mapping feature, producers can import and view other shapefiles, such as precision agriculture planting boundaries. This allows producers to view, save, print and label their own maps for acreage reporting purposes. To access mapping features and other helpful on-line tools, producers need level 2 eAuth access linked to their Business Partner customer record. Visit farmers.gov/account to learn how to create a farmers.gov account.

In addition to mapping tools, a farmers.gov account offers a variety of self-service opportunities for FSA and Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) customers, including managing FSA farm loans and NRCS conservation contracts.

Video tutorials, including how to use mapping tools, are available on the farmers.gov YouTube channel. Learn more about a farmers.gov account.

You cannot apply for your survivor benefit online, so you will need to call Social Security, at either the national number (1.800.772.1213) or your

local Social Security office, to make an appointment to apply for your benefit as your husband's widow.

And to answer your last question, your state pension won't affect your monthly Social Security payments because you paid Social Security FICA payroll taxes from your municipal earnings.
