1 It doesn't get more exciting than the race that took place in England recently. Indiana Arts Awards Athens Arts Grant

The Indiana Arts Commission has awarded \$ 10,745 to Athens Arts Gallery through the Arts Organization Support grant program.

"The projects and organizations selected to receive funding are strengthening our state," said Anne Penny Valentine, Chair of the Indiana Arts Commission. "The Commission is excited and honored to invest in Hoosier communities, supporting organizations that are doing exceptional creative work to make Indiana a great place to live, work, play, study, and stay."

The IAC approved funding recommendations for Arts Project Support and Arts Organization Support grant programs at its June 9 meeting. Athens Arts was one of more than 480 applications reviewed by 146 panelists from around the state and country with expertise in the arts, community development

and nonprofit management.

"Athens Arts will use these funds to strengthen our on-line presence and continue to celebrate the creative life of our community through classes and events," Diana McCormick, Athens Arts Executive Director, said. "Athens Arts will be able to offer opportunities to engage the community in art and continue to keep class fees affordable for our community. I would like to thank Indiana Senate District 7 State Senator Brian Buchanan and Indiana House District 44 State Representative Beau Baird for the Arts Organization Support grant, which will provide us operating support for the ongoing artistic and administrative functions of Athens Arts. I am thrilled that Athens Arts has shown that we matter – that ART Matters in our community. These funds will allow Athens Arts to continue the mission to have Crawfordsville become a

place for the visual arts. A community will thrive when there is a vibrant art community."

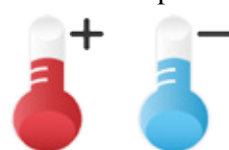
Miah Michaelsen, Executive Director of the Indiana Arts Commission, agreed.

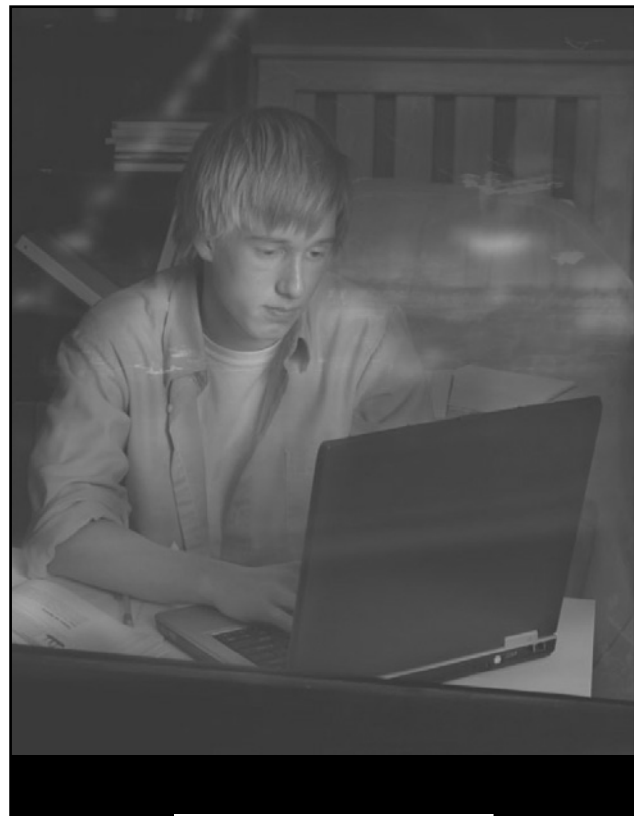

 ESTABLISHING PARK RULES AND AMENDING ORDINANCE 2013-8**
 WHEREAS, The Town Council of the Town of New Richmond, Indiana is advised of the authority granted to it by the Indiana General Assembly, specifically by not limited to IC 36-7-2; IC 36-8-2.4; and IC 36-14-11; AND
 WHEREAS, the Town Council of the Town of New Richmond, recognizes that for the enjoyment of all, certain rules for use and conduct within the park facilities must be established, AND
 WHEREAS, the Town Council of the Town of New Richmond, desires to protect the health, safety, and welfare of all persons, groups, and organizations that use the park facilities of the Town of New Richmond, Indiana.
 BE IT ORDAINED, by the Town Council of the Town of New Richmond, Indiana, that the following rules for use and conduct within the park facilities of the Town of New Richmond, Indiana are hereby established:
 SECTION 1. Town Pond
 1. No swimming or wading in the pond.
 2. No boats, canoes, or other water conveyances allowed in the pond.
 3. Fishing is allowed during park hours. All fish except bluegills are catch and release from the pond.
 4. No one is allowed on the ice when the pond is frozen.
 SECTION 2. Vehicles
 1. All vehicles, including golf carts, off-road vehicles, snow mobiles and dirt bikes, must stay on the roadway.
 2. With the exception of events at the park, per prior approval from the Town.
 3. Speed limit in the park is 10 miles per hour.
 SECTION 3. Park Rules
 1. Park closed from 10:00 p.m. through 5:00 a.m. Sunday through Thursday morning.
 11:01 p.m. to 5:00 a.m. Friday and Saturday.
 Exception for July 4th event or when event is rescheduled due to weather. Exception for all Town or Special events at the park.
 2. No alcoholic beverages are allowed in the park.
 3. All persons or groups using the park facilities must put all trash in receptacles or take with you.
 4. No skate boards, bicycles or other items of transportation shall be permitted on picnic tables.
 5. Do not remove picnic tables from shelter house, unless prior written approval from the Town.
 6. No open flames, unless prior written approval from the Town.
 7. No personal fireworks.
 8. All noise must be kept to a level so as not to disturb the peace of the adjacent property owners.
 9. No overnight camping allowed without prior written approval from the Town.
 SECTION 4. Vandalism
 Definition: Willful or malicious destruction or defacement of public or private property, graffiti, trash dumping, light smashing, removing and bending signage or ornamentation, breaking windows or doors, or other defacing of property.
 1. Any person vandalizing the park will be prosecuted.
 2. Any person caught vandalizing the park will be fined and charged for the cost of damages done.
 3. Any person violating any provision of this ordinance shall also be liable for payment of the costs of prosecution, including reasonable attorney fees.
 SECTIONS 6. Reservations
 1. Reservations for the shelter house must be made through the New Richmond Town Clerk/Treasurer in a timely manner; any town-sponsored events/activities have precedence.
 SECTION 5. Fines
 Vandalism \$500.00 plus damages per occurrence.

 1st Offense - \$0
 2nd Offense - \$100
 3rd Offense - \$200
 4th Offense - \$400
 SECTION 6. Enforcement
 Any person designated by the town, county, state, a municipal government, or a law enforcement officer who is qualified to perform such duties under the laws of the state or Town Marshal or any Deputy Town Marshal.

 CURFEW FOR MINORS**

SECTION
1. Definitions
2. Violations
3. Enforcement
1. DEFINITIONS
 As used within this Ordinance, the following words and phrases shall have the meanings ascribed to them below.
 "Curfew hours" refers to the hours of 10:00 p.m. through 5:00 a.m. on Sunday through Thursday morning and 11:01 p.m. through 5:00 a.m. on Friday and Saturday. October 15 through November 1, curfew hours are 9:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m., regardless of the day of the week.
 "Emergency" refers to unforeseen circumstances, or the status or condition resulting therefrom, requiring immediate action to safeguard life, limb or property. The term includes, but is not limited to, fires, natural disasters, automobile accident, or other similar circumstances.
 "Establishment" refers to any privately-owned place of business within the Town of New Richmond, Indiana, operated for a profit, to which the public is invited, including, but not limited to any place of amusement or entertainment. With respect to such Establishment, the term "Operator" shall mean any person, and any firm, association, partnership (and the members or partners thereof) and/or any corporation (and the officers thereof) conducting or managing that Establishment.
 "Minor" refers to any person under eighteen (18) years of age who has not been emancipated by court order.
 "Officer" refers to a police or other law enforcement officer charged with the duty of enforcing the laws of the State of Indiana and/or the ordinances of the Town of New Richmond, Indiana.
 "Parent" refers to
 (1) a person who is a minor's biological or adoptive parent and who has legal custody of a minor (including either parent, if custody is shared under a court order or agreement);
 (2) a person who is the biological. or adoptive parent with whom a minor regularly resides;
 (3) a person judicially appointed as a legal guardian of the minor; and/or;
 (4) a person eighteen (18) years of age or older standing in loco parentis (as indicated by the authorization of an individual listed in part(s) (1), (2) or (3) of this definition, above, for the person to assume the care or physical custody of the child, or as indicated by any other circumstances).
 "Person" refers to an individual, not to any association, corporation, or any other legal entity.
 "Public Place" refers to any place to which the public or a substantial group of the public has access, including, but not limited to streets, roads, sidewalks, alleys, avenues, parks, and/or the common areas of apartment houses, office buildings, transportation facilities and shops.
 "Remain" refers to the following actions:
 (1) to linger or slay at or upon a place; and/or
 (2) to fail to leave a place when requested to do so by an officer or by the owner, operator or other person in control of that place.
 "Temporary care facility" refers to a non-locked, non-restrictive shelter at which minors may wait, under visual supervision to be retrieved by a parent. No minors waiting in such facility shall be handcuffed and/or secured (by handcuffs or otherwise) to any stationary object.
2. VIOLATIONS
 (a) It shall be unlawful for a minor, during curfew hours, to remain in or upon any Public Place within the Town, to remain in any motor vehicle operating or parked therein, or to remain in or upon the premises of any Establishment within the Town, unless:
 (1) the minor is accompanied by a parent; or
 (2) the minor is involved in an emergency; or
 (3) the minor is engaged in an employment activity, or is going to or returning home from such activity, without detour or stop; or
 (4) the minor is on the sidewalk directly abutting a place where he or she resides with a parent; or
 (5) the minor is attending an activity sponsored by a school, religious, or civic organization, by a public organization or agency, or by another similar organization or entity, which activity is supervised by adults, and/or the minor is going to or returning from such an activity without detour or stop; or
 (6) the minor is on an errand at the direction of a parent, and the minor has in his or her possession in writing signed by the parent containing the following information, the name, signature, address and telephone number of the parent authorizing the errand, the telephone number where the parent may be reached during the errand, the name of the minor, and a brief description of the errand, the minor's destination(s) and the hours the minor is authorized to be engaged in the errand; or
 (7) the minor is involved in interstate travel through, or beginning or terminating in, the Town of New Richmond, Indiana, or
 (8) the minor is exercising First Amendment rights protected by the United States Constitution, such as the free exercise of religion, freedom of speech, or the right of assembly.
 (b) It shall be unlawful for a minor's parent to knowingly permit, allow or encourage such minor to violate this Ordinance.
 (c) It shall be unlawful for a person who is the owner or operator of any motor vehicle to knowingly permit, allow or encourage a violation of this Ordinance.
 (d) It shall be unlawful for the Operator of any Establishment or for any person who is an employee thereof, to knowingly permit, allow or encourage a minor to remain upon the premises of the Establishment during curfew hours. It shall be a defense to prosecution under this subsection that the Operator or employee of an Establishment promptly notified the police department that a minor was present at the Establishment after curfew hours and refused to leave.
 (e) It shall be unlawful for my person (including any minor) to give a false name, address, or telephone number to any officer investigating a possible violation of this section Ordinance.
3. ENFORCEMENT
 (1) Minors. Before taking any enforcement action hereunder, an officer shall make an immediate investigation for the purpose of ascertaining whether or not the presence of a minor in a public place, motor vehicle and/or Establishment within the Town during Curfew hours is in violation of this Ordinance.
 (A) if such investigation reveals that the presence of such minor is in violation of this Ordinance; then:
 (1) if the minor has not previously been issued a warning for any such violation, then the officer shall issue a verbal warning to the minor, which shall be followed by a written warning mailed by the police department to the minor and his or her parent(s); or
 (2) if the minor has previously been issued a warning for any such violation, then the violation shall be considered a delinquent act as defined by Indiana Code 3 1-37- 1-2; and.
 (B) As soon as practicable, the officer shall:
 (1) release the minor to his or her parent(s);
 (2) if a minor's parent(s) cannot be located, place the minor in a temporary care facility for a period not to exceed the remainder of the curfew hours and/or take the minor to a judge or intake officer of the juvenile court to be dealt with in the manner and pursuant to such procedures as required by law.
 (C) If an investigation by an officer reveals that a person has violated this Ordinance, and if the person has not previously been issued a warning with respect to any such violation, an officer shall issue a verbal warning to the person, which shall be followed by a written warning mailed by the police department to that person; however, if any such warning has previously been issued to that person that the officer shall charge the person with a violation and shall issue a summons directing the person to appear in court.
 (2) In addition to any other enforcement provisions in this ordinance, any person violating this ordinance shall be fined the following:
 (A) 1st Offense - \$0
 (B) 2nd Offense - \$100
 (C) 3rd Offense - \$200
 (D) 4th Offense - \$400
 Any person violating any provision of this ordinance shall also be liable for payment of the costs of prosecution, including reasonable attorney fees.

Chip Seal Operations Starting On Or After July 24 In Putnam County

The Indiana Department of Transportation announces continued chip sealing operations on U.S. 36, near Danville and on U.S. 231 near Greencastle. U.S. 36 will be temporarily closed from approximately 0.18 miles east of State Road 75 to approximately 0.6 miles west of S.R. 39 starting on or after Monday, July 24, weather permitting. The closure is expected to last for at least a week, weather permitting.

U.S. 231 will be temporarily closed from approximately 1.05 miles north of I-70 to approximately 0.22 miles south of S.R. 240 starting on or after Wednesday, July 26, weather permitting. The closure is expected to last for at least a week, weather permitting.

Crews will place message boards at each end of the project to alert the traveling public. INDOT

suggests finding alternative routes during the short duration of the chip sealing operation.

Work is completed under lane closures with flagging, or a full closure, to prevent damage to both vehicles and the roadway. During operations, existing pavement is coated with liquid asphalt, which seals cracks and provides waterproof protection. This extends the service life of the roadway and lowers maintenance costs. Once the seal coat is complete, loose aggregate is applied and swept from the road. After a curing period, crews will return to fog seal the new driving surface and apply pavement markings.

INDOT makes every effort to reduce vehicle damage during and immediately after chip seal projects. While these efforts may not prevent all damage to vehicles during the chip seal process, they have substantially

reduced the likelihood of damage.

INDOT safety efforts include posting reduced speeds in work zones; closing roadways or lanes during chip seal projects; and sweeping the roadway during the chip seal process and after project completion to eliminate loose stones.

Chip seal is a cost-effective pavement preservation technique that is

utilized across the state of Indiana, saving an estimated six to 14 dollars in taxpayer expenditures for every dollar invested in extending the life of a roadway.

Motorists should slow down, watch for stopped traffic and drive distraction-free through all work zones. All work is weather dependent and schedules are subject to change.

US 41 Restrictions Starting On Or After July 14 For Bridge Maintenance In Fountain County

The Indiana Department of Transportation announces restrictions on U.S. 41 starting on or after Friday, July 14 for bridge maintenance near Veedersburg. U.S. 41 northbound will be restricted between E. Division Rd. and E. 50 S., approximately 0.27 miles north of I-74. Traffic will be controlled by temporary signals. Once crews are finished working on the northbound lane, they will then restrict the southbound lane. These restrictions are expected to last through the beginning of August, weather permitting.

This contract was awarded to Pacific Painting Co. and involves maintenance on six bridges. It involves two bridges in Fountain County on U.S. 41, one bridge in Montgomery County on State Road 32, and three bridges on U.S. 231 in both Tippecanoe and Montgomery County. Crews will be performing polymeric overlays to provide additional years of service to the bridges. The entire contract is expected to be completed in October of 2023, weather permitting.

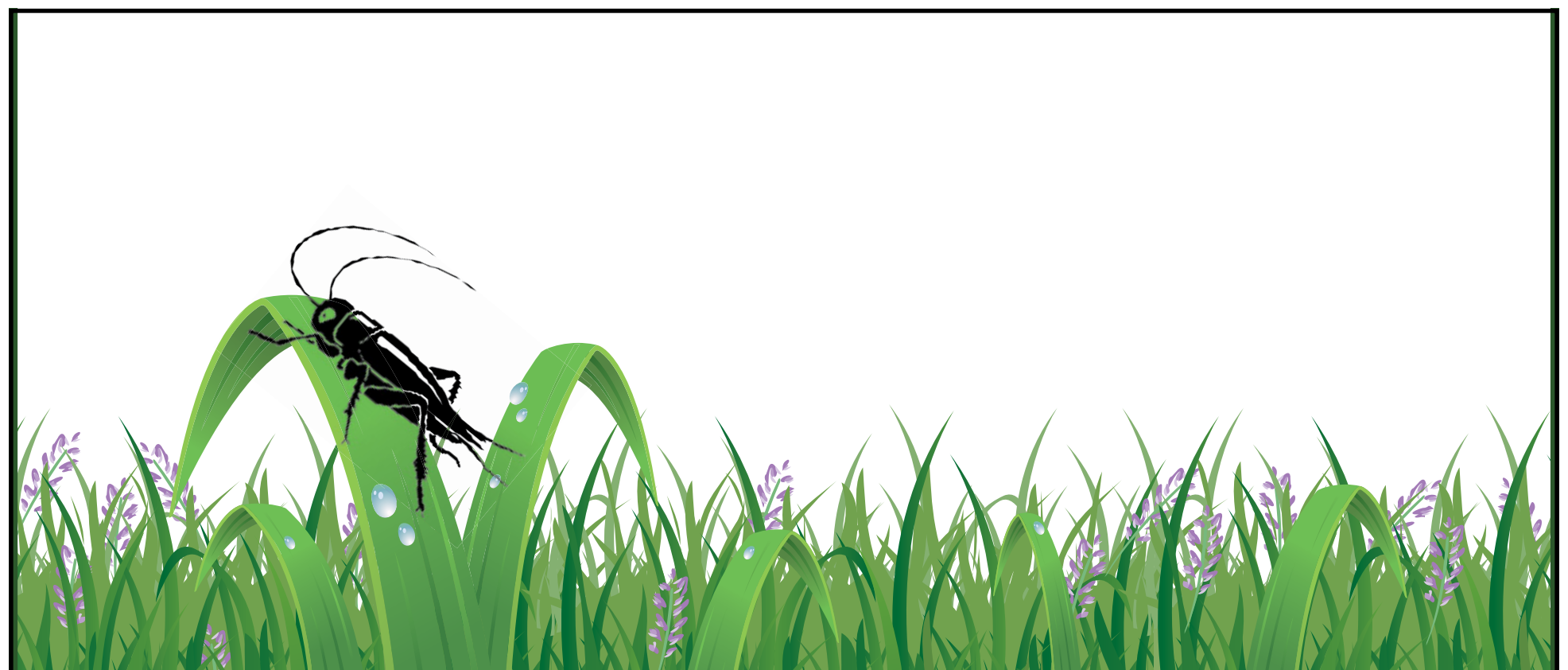

follow the new Federal Law and not consider race or give racial preference to any students on admission decisions. The ruling, which is not a law per se, creates a hodgepodge of uncertainty and responses across the nation's colleges and corporations.

But not every decision handed down created a long-tailed reaction and conversation. The case called Moore v. Harper, which pressed for a fringe reading of the Constitution to give unchecked authority to state legislatures when redistricting and writing election procedures, was hailed a success for the American election system. If you've been busy and missed why it matters, here's why the League thinks it's worth understanding.

Let's start with the implications of the ruling. Why should we care so much about how states redistrict and write election rules? These are procedural matters that can't compete with urgent concerns of daily life – interest rates, housing shortages, food and medical costs and lack of affordable child-care. Like inflation, which is affecting costs, these items are “anchored” to expectations. Companies and the Federal Reserve monitor price points to keep those anchored to consumers' emotions – somewhere at the tipping point of our optimism and fear. In this system, emotions, those volatile shapeshifters, are a data point. Our bank accounts and cash flows dominate our headspace. Economic policy has immediate consequences compared to the procedural rules about voting. In that emotional vortex, it's easy to conflate economic systems with democratic policies, though they are separate frameworks. Consider that democracies elsewhere around the world play nice with more than just capitalist economic systems.

What keeps a democracy in balance is when the legislators are aligned with the people they represent. Our alarm bells should go off when the will of the legislators and the people grows apart. When that happens, tensions rise. Something has to give.

When the gap of disaffection grows between the Legislative Branch, which it has for decades (according to Gallup polls in September 2022, 62 percent of Americans had not very much confidence or no confidence at all

in Congress) then it puts pressure on the Executive Branch to use unilateral executive actions for the will of the people. Of course, that branch will favor one of the two major parties because the U.S. has come to rely on the two-party system. The pitfall of having only two dominant parties is that they tend to pit issues as two-sided, as either / or, but most of us hold more nuanced understandings of key issues. Feeling pigeon-holed by political rhetoric, some voters give in and “vote for the lesser of two evils.” At least something is happening! Some resist, voting third party, though it inevitably loses. Some desist, refusing to vote. Others give in to total distrust and vote for anyone who seems likely to blow up a system they perceive as dysfunctional. Most of us are saying, *You're not hearing us. You're not listening.*

So when polling demonstrates that a majority of Americans feel Congress is a do-nothing institution, people turns to the Executive Branch. That branch overreaches, which leads to challenges in the courts. Now the Judicial Branch makes decisions that seem to please one party over another. And, the hairs on the backs of necks raise. Our government seems to be moving away from the compromise-based center that democracy creates.

For a while, the population generally trusted the Supreme Court as the final ballast. A ballast is a heavy material placed in the hold of a ship or the gondola of a balloon to enhance stability. Enhancement is its role, not being the last holdout. What happens when the Executive Branch, and now the Judicial Branch face sustained, imbalanced pressure from lack of Congressional action? They begin to show signs of strain and distrust.

If people feel powerless, they get angry, they foment conspiracy ideas, their distrust grows. These are the seeds of protest.


What does it take to prevent the seeds of protest to turn into weeds of violence? Either the government must more accurately represent and serve its people, or its leaders must move the people, not through merely laws – a kind of because we said so – but through persuasion. There must be tangible evidence that reducing abortion improves the nation, that eradicating

affirmative action will not disaffect whole swaths of our population. If the people disagree, legislators must listen to the will of the people, which is why we cannot allow state legislatures to have unchallenged authority when writing election rules. We cannot have a government by the people and for the people if one side hoards control.

Moore v. Harper matters here in Indiana. When we went through redistricting in 2021, a non-partisan group hosted listening sessions so our legislators would understand what Hoosiers wanted. Voters in Greencastle asked that their district NOT include state prisoners as residents of the district to bloat the size of that district. MoCo residents sought a unified district, instead of being split up. Hoosiers asked for competitive districting that better represented the actual voting patterns of Hoosiers. We may be a red state but it has sizable independent and blue voting blocks. The dominance of Republicans in state and federal offices is not equivalent to the number of Democrat and independent and third-party voters. When that gap persists and grows, the government is no longer by the people and citizens will increasingly doubt it's for the people. What recourse are citizens left with? Voting.

The decision in Moore v. Harper empowered the citizenry. It shot down a theory called “independent state legislature theory” which balanced the right of citizens to challenge state legislatures' redistricting and election rulemaking and prevents the legislative branch from stacking power for the ruling party. It means people can appeal to the judicial branch to say, “Hey, wait a minute. We are being disenfranchised here.” It says that no legislature can exercise self-protecting will without the checks and balances of other branches of the government. Hopefully, it protects our democracy longer.

Attorney General Todd Rokita And Team Make National Impact By Leading Fight Against Woke Anti-Consumer ESG Strategies

Attorney General Todd Rokita's leadership of a 17-state effort opposing the anti-capitalism and anti-consumer schemes of so-called ESG investing has helped prompt action at the federal level.

“Our team here in Indiana works hard to protect liberty, free enterprise and the rule of law,” Rokita said. “With servants' hearts, we aspire each day to defend the interests of individual Hoosiers across the state. And through collaboration with other states, we make a positive difference for all Americans.”

In May, Rokita co-lead a multistate motion to intervene in the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission's (FERC's) dealings with BlackRock, the world's largest asset manager. BlackRock has sought to force a radical climate agenda on American utility companies.

Following that action, a group of 11 U.S. senators has also demanded that FERC investigate BlackRock's actions — and BlackRock's CEO has begun backpedaling from the company's past record.

This month, Rokita and other attorneys general penned a letter to BlackRock Mutual Funds trustees warning them of potential deceptive and unfair acts and practices — and violations of state securities laws and state common law.

ESG investing seeks to impose an “environmental, social and governance” agenda that could not otherwise be implemented through the ballot box.

At least one of the 11 senators demanding the FERC investigation cited the 17-state motion to intervene as inspiring the senators' letter.

Previously, BlackRock has signed onto activist crusades such as Climate Action 100+ (CA100+) and the Net Zero Asset Managers (NZAM) initiatives — which seek to coordinate shareholder voting power across their membership to influence the operations of utilities.

“Ultimately, the radical activists would force utilities to retire all of their gas and coal plants,” Rokita said. “But gas and coal represent over 60%

of America's electricity supply. Losing this energy would weaken our country and raise utility bills for regular Americans, including elderly Hoosiers on fixed incomes.”

Further, he added, the ESG strategies diminish the value of retirees' investment accounts.

According to news reports, BlackRock CEO Larry Fink proposed replacing the term “ESG” with “conscientious capitalism” because of the negative perceptions of the former term.

“Whatever you call it, an investment strategy aimed at achieving woke left-wing outcomes rather than maximizing returns for investors is bad news,” Rokita said. “There's no point trying to put lipstick on that pig.”

Aside from the BlackRock example, Attorney General Rokita has also led efforts against ESG investing in other cases — filing another motion to intervene in a case involving the Vanguard Group, for example, and filing a lawsuit against the Biden administration over a Department of Labor
