isn't actually a fluffy BuzzFeed quiz. You pick the points you earn from checking off any of those, but if you didn't read or hear much about labor, then you can give yourself a point for finishing this column.

What we're talking about when we're talking about labor transcends employment statistics. We're discussing labor from the perspective of people, not disembodied economies.

We're starting with support for unions because unions transformed working conditions, pay rates, time off, and benefits starting as far back as the 1880s (here in Indiana.) But union support slipped from the

1980s until the past few years. Then in 2022 and 2023, nearly two-thirds of Americans said they support unions, according to Gallup polls.

Not that more Hoosiers sought out collective bargaining or joined their local union. Whereas 22 percent of employed Hoosiers were covered by unions in 1989, only about 9 percent are presently covered, according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics.

In 2012, Indiana jumped on the Right to Work bandwagon, joining 25 other states where lobbying and educational campaigns against unions had eroded their contribution to bargaining for fair wages, safer working conditions, and benefits such as retirement and healthcare. Fiscal conservatives leaned on the sentiments of Milton Friedman, who wrote in Free to Choose: A Personal Statement that free, meaning unregulated, markets will always sort themselves out and provide better outcomes for the economy.

But "better outcomes for the economy" are not the same as better outcomes for lower and middle-class households. A strong economy doesn't simply trickle down to smalltown Americans. Wages for those socio-economic classes have stagnated since the 1970s


compelling many Americans to cobble together a 40-plus-hour work week from multiple parttime jobs.

Many workers lack health insurance because it's generally tied to having the right kind of job. Costs of healthcare have risen such that we pay higher premiums, have higher deductibles and accrue more outof-pocket expenses. Notably, Americans pay more for healthcare and live shorter lives than people in nations with universal healthcare, as Nicholas Kristoff and Sheryl Wudann report in their latest book Tightrope: Americans Reaching for Hope. In spite of arguments about U.S. innovation in American healthcare, our system is not improving health. Furthermore, Kristoff and Wudann report that low and middle-class Americans diagnosed with cancer depleted their household funds within two years of diagnosis, leaving crushing financial crises for their living loved ones.

Amazingly, aid distributed to households and local governments during the pandemic from childcare funds to straightup cash – temporarily eased the crush on working-class families, but that couldn't last. Money



Fewer Hoosier Kids Take Advantage Of Free Summer Meals, Despite Ongoing Hunger Challenges A New Food Research & Action Center Report Shows Decline In Breakfasts And Lunches Served In Indiana.

Thousands of Hoosier kids are missing out on free breakfast and lunch, even though nutrition advocates say many Indiana families continue to struggle with hunger and food insecurity.

That's according to a new report by the Food Research & Action Center (FRAC), a national nonprofit that aims to reduce poverty-related hunger.

FRAC's report indicates that nearly 58,000 fewer children in Indiana received a lunch on an average day in July 2022, a decrease of more than 50% from the previous summer. Data for 2022 is the latest to be released.

Participation rates for breakfast fell even further as 60,000 fewer children received breakfast on an average day in July 2022, a decrease of about 81% compared to July 2021.

The decline in participation follows previous increases in summer meal participation in 2020 and 2021.

Across the country, every other state also saw a decrease in the average daily participation in summer lunch in July 2022 compared to July 2021, according to FRAC.

Child nutrition waivers issued by the U.S. Department of Agriculture make the free meals available at summer meal sites, oftentimes located at schools and community centers. While waiver access was expanded during the COVID-19 pandemic, eligibility restrictions are back in place, meaning fewer kids can access free meals.

"During the height of the pandemic, families could drive through summer meal sites and pick up multiple meals for a few days, making the process a whole lot easier for many," said Emily Weikert Bryant, executive director of Feeding Indiana's Hungry, an Indianapolis-based nonprofit focused on increasing Hoosiers' access to food. "As we've returned more to normal operating procedures, we just don't have the ability to reach as many kids with as many meals."

Although state and federal officials have piloted new programs to get additional kids fed, Bryant said many still lack access to nutritious foods.

"Congress addressed this with a couple of new options that were piloted and developed during the pandemic but they seem unlikely to address child nutrition programs again soon," she continued, emphasizing that "summers add an extra level of hardship for families at risk of hunger."

Summer meal options

The two federal summer nutrition programs the Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) and National School Lunch Program (NSLP) — provide funding to serve meals and snacks to children at sites during summer vacation or the extended breaks of year-round schools. The programs also can be used to feed children during unanticipated school closures. The SFSP is a federally-funded, state-administered program that reimburses approved program operators who serve free, healthy meals and snacks to children under age 18 in low-income areas when school is not in session.

Sponsorship is open to public and private nonprofit groups, including local governments, summer camps, religious organizations and recreation centers. Organizations may also consider partnering with an existing sponsor, such as a school corporation, to serve students in areas where kids lack good nutrition during the summer months.

Separately, the NSLP is available for schools that operate summer school. Only the students enrolled in summer school can receive a meal, however.

The FRAC report indicates the number of SFSP sponsors and sites decreased from July 2021 to July 2022.

Specific data obtained by the Indiana Capital Chronicle from the Indiana Department of Education shows there were 280 sponsors and 2,035 sites statewide that provided summer meals in 2021. That decreased to 192 sponsors providing summer meals at 1,047 sites in 2023.

FRAC experts and state officials attribute much of the decrease in participation to the reintroduction of limitations on summer nutrition programs.

Prior to the pandemic, to qualify as a summer meal site, at least 50% of the children in a given geographic area had to be eligible for free or reduced-price school meals, or at least 50% of kids participating in the program at the site had to be individually determined eligible for free or reduced-price school meals. Sites that primarily served migrant children also qualified.

Once a site was determined eligible, all children who come to the site can eat for free, regardless of their economic or migrant status.

Through the program, a sponsor enters into an agreement with the state education department to run the program and receives reimbursement for each eligible meal and snack served at meal sites.

That changed, though, during the pandemic from Spring 2020 through Summer 2022 — when states could utilize a nationwide child nutrition waiver that allowed any community to have a summer meal site.

Although waivers were technically available for Summer 2022, Congress did not extend the waivers again until late June, which IDOE officials said was "too late" for Indiana's SFSP operations.

This year, federal meal program eligibility returned to standard procedure, meaning only low-income areas were qualified to participate.

FRAC noted that program staffing shortages, supply chain disruptions and many meal sites shuttering as a result of the pandemic additionally led to fewer children receiving a summer lunch in 2022 and 2023.

Why are fewer kids participating?

FRAC's goal is for all states to feed summer lunches to 40 kids for every 100 children who received free or reduced-price lunch in the 2021–2022 school year. As of July 2022, just eight students in Indiana received a summer lunch per every 100 students who ate school lunches during the regular academic year, according to FRAC.

To meet the nonprofit's goal, the Hoosier state would need to increase the number of students served summer lunches by more than 200,000: from 54,445 kids to more than 268,000. That equates to more than \$19 million in additional federal reimbursement dollars for summer lunches.

Bryant applauded IDOE for a program piloted this summer that allowed additional meals sites in rural areas. Kids in certain parts of the state were able to access meals without having to be present at that site to eat the meal, "which is a big step toward increasing summer meals," Bryant said.

"We need to see more of this — not just in rural areas — but anywhere, because we know it's not just finding a location but getting to it each day to sit and eat the meal on site that can be difficult," she added.

Bryant and FRAC also pointed to federal legislation adopted in December 2022, creating a permanent program that will provide an Electronic Benefit Transfer (EBT) card to purchase food during the summer months to families eligible for free or reduced-price school meals, extending the summer benefits families have received through the Pandemic EBT Program. The legislation takes effect next summer.

"It's a great step forward because SNAP benefits don't go up in the summer when kids are

eating at home," Bryant said. "These innovations, borne from the pandemic, will help more children access what they need when they're out of school. What will be important going forward is insuring these programs are as accessible as possible by encouraging Congress and the administrating agencies to reduce barriers to program access, streamlining program administration to encourage more site and agency participation, and insuring the benefits are adequate to really be helpful."

She said families can also access food banks and food pantries in the summer — or any time for extra help stretching their grocery budget.

Still, FRAC is urging policymakers to improve summer meals access. At the state level, that includes better advertisement about summer meals to families, as well as more financial support for summer food sponsors to increase the number of available meal sites. More broadly, the hunger relief organization called on the federal government to lower the eligibility threshold from 50% to 40%, and to make permanently increase funding for summer and after school programs where meals can be served.

3 Ways People Of All Ages Can Give Back

Volunteer

Nonprofit organizations and NGOs need volunteer power to deliver support to the communities they collaborate with. If you're an adult wanting to facilitate youth volunteerism, consider organizing a youth-specific event or helping transport the young people in your life to an event. To find a volunteer opportunity that aligns with your interests and availability, check out Points of Light Engage, a database with hundreds of thousands of in-person and virtual volunteer opportunities.

The power of volunteering is apparent when considering Daily Point of Light Award honoree Nate Buescher, a high schooler who prepares food for a local food pantry and distributes home-cooked meals to tent cities around Chicago. Buescher began fighting food insecurity at age 7 with the Honeycomb Project. Today, he mentors younger volunteers while maintaining his own service projects.

Voice

The youth voice is vital, pointing us to which concerns are most important to future world leaders and helping broaden perspectives. Use your voice to advocate for causes you care about by posting on social media, attending a rally or contacting a government leader. Adults can amplify youth voices by sharing with their networks, or organizing forums for youth to be seen and heard.

Young people can commit to thoroughly researching causes they care about, talking to those working toward solutions and holding space for those impacted. Adults can connect with the young people in their lives, inviting dialogue that allows for sharing different perspectives and finding common ground.

These are the driving ideas behind the work of high schooler Kristie To, who became a leading force in Asian American racial justice when she founded Hearts Against Hate. Among the initiatives of her nonprofit is distributing Asian history and Asian American Pacific Islander civil rights curriculum to children.

"Cultural sensitivity starts with exposure, and that's what we're trying to do with these elementary schoolers," says To.

"There are many formal channels for civic engagement, but simple actions make a difference too," says Quest. "Whether it's carrying groceries in for a neighbor or donating books to the library, the important thing is to get started when you see a need in your community."

It's why people work. A job that pays well and isn't dangerous imbues a sense of industriousness and satisfaction and improves psycho-social well-being as much as well-spent leisure time. A job like that exists because ethical organizations listen to the collective needs of their workers. People need to be able to cover their bills and have some left in order not to live in a state of heightened anxiety. All workers deserve work-life balance, that ability to come home ready to engage without job-and-pay-related stress to foster strong relationships with their partners, children, families, friends, and neighbors. That's where unions

are proven to help.

Consider a recent report on joint training and credentialing partnerships between employers and unions. Those joint partnerships invested more money in apprenticeship training than employer-only programs, as the Midwest Economic Policy Institute reported in 2023. The report from MEPI looked at construction apprenticeships and found that union-employer partnership programs trained more skilled workers than other programs. Indiana Public Broadcasting's Adam Yahya Rayes reported in August that between 2015 and 2022, 43 percent of students graduated from union partnerships and earned an average of \$31.28 per hour. Graduation rates at Ivy Tech were lower, near 36 percent during that time, and graduates earned an average hourly wage of \$22.60. Employer-only training programs graduated at about the same lower rate as Ivy Tech and earned much less, an average of \$17.47 per hour.

Unions transformed lives starting back in the age of the Robber Barons, namely Andrew Carnegie (steel tycoon),

man died in the mine, fellow miners deposited his corpse on the front stoop. If he was injured, their friends laid their broken bodies on the kitchen table under the one bare bulb a shack was likely to have, that way the family could see to doctor him.

Upton Sinclair's The Jungle chronicles such exploitations in the meat packing industry. Companies sold houses on contract at obscene prices to their workers. Bosses assaulted their female workers, and the jobs were so dangerous that workers were frequently mutilated or killed. First published in serial form in 1905, The Jungle horrified readers, but not for the right reasons. Descriptions of rotting meat contaminated with toxic chemicals, dirt, sawdust, and rat droppings appalled American consumers.

"I aimed at the public's heart," Sinclair said, "and by accident, I hit it in the stomach." Instead of worker protections and unionization, the public called for and got food safety inspections. Unions saved lives.

Today their work may seem less urgent. Maybe most workers' conditions seem bearable enough. Then again Texas just enacted a law that prohibits workers from taking extra water breaks. Today, some meat packers wear diapers on the job because they aren't allowed enough bathroom breaks. Amazon has notoriously tracked every move of workers demanding faster order packing. White-collar workers now have their computers monitored for keystrokes, meetings, and activity so bosses can monitor them every minute.

Maybe people can scrape together enough money to make rent, juggle the bills, and get groceries. Then again, Credit.com found that 73 percent of Americans die with an average debt of \$62,000. Clearly,




