Ask Rusty - How Do Disability Programs Affect Social Security's Budget?

Dear Rusty: I read with interest an analysis of the history, reasons, and financial costs of the SSI (Supplemental Security Income) and SSDI (Social Security Disability Insurance) programs. My question is, specifically, what portion of the Social Security budget goes toward SSI and SSDI vs. for regular SS retirement income for those who paid into the fund during their working lives? How are the costs of SSI and SSDI covered by the federal government? When did these two sections of the budget enter the law and what was the impetus behind them? Signed: An Inquiring Mind

Dear Inquiring Mind: No part of Social Security's "budget" is used to pay SSI (Supplemental Security Income). SSI is a means-tested general assistance program for disadvantaged children and needy disabled adults and aged seniors who have very little income and very few assets. Federal SSI benefits are paid from the government's General Treasury, not from Social Security

Trust Funds. SSI is jointly administered by the person's state of residence and the Social Security Administration, and the state usually provides additional benefits to supplement the financial assistance provided by the federal government under the SSI program. The Social Security Administration only administers the SSI program, it does not fund it.

By contrast, SSDI (Social Security Disability Insurance) benefits are for employed Americans who become disabled and unable to work full time. SSDI benefits are meant to provide limited income replacement for the disabled worker, and those benefits are paid from a separate Social Security "DI" (Disability Insurance) Trust Fund. The DI

fund receives a portion (0.9%) of the FICA SS payroll taxes every American worker pays on their earnings and is used to pay disability benefits to eligible American workers who are unable to perform "substantial gainful activity" for a year or more. The eligibility criteria to collect SSDI are very strict, but those approved receive their benefits from this separate DI trust fund, not from Social Security's Old Age and Survivors Trust Fund. Payroll taxes collected for disability purposes are deposited in the DI Trust Fund as interest-bearing government bonds, and those DI assets are redeemed as needed to pay SSDI benefits. FYI, SSDI (disability) benefits

BBB Scam Alert: Social Media Discount Code Shopping Scam

Recently, BBB Scam Tracker has received multiple reports of an online shopping scam on TikTok. It's a sneaky one! It starts with a disgruntled employee supposedly seeking revenge and ends with victims ordering hundreds of dollars in phony merchandise.

How the scam works

You come across a TikTok video featuring someone claiming they were recently fired at a high-end jewelry store. The termination was completely undeserved, and they are angry. To take their revenge, they are sharing their top-secret employee discount code with anyone who wants it. This code gives you up to 100 percent off the company's merchandise. That's right, they claim you can get expensive jewelry for free! As long as you're willing to pay shipping, that is.

You may notice some red flags when you checkout using

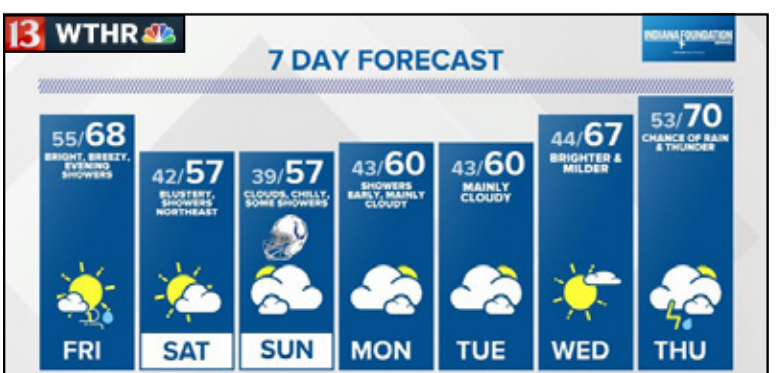

Baird Seeks Farmers' Input On Improving Land Drainage Laws

With the last two Drainage Task Force meetings scheduled for later this month, State Rep. Beau Baird encourages Hoosier farmers to provide their input on how lawmakers can improve Indiana's agricultural drainage laws.

Baird co-chairs the Drainage Task Force, which was established by legislation from the 2022 session to review responsibilities between landowners and the state on drainage issues and whether changes can be made to the laws to give farmers more control over

addressing drainage concerns on their land.

"Farmers have a tough job, and the state imposing overly burdensome regulations on them can make it even tougher," Baird said. "I've heard from many landowners who are concerned about this issue, and I encourage more to provide feedback so lawmakers have the information they need to strike a better balance between land rights and protecting the environment."

or h44@iga.in.gov. The final Drainage Task Force meetings are scheduled for noon on Oct. 11 in the House Chamber and 2 p.m. on Oct. 25 in the Senate Chamber at the Statehouse in Indianapolis.

Members of the public are welcome to attend and testify at the meetings, which will also be livestreamed and archived online at iga.in.gov.

The task force's findings and any policy recommendations will be reported to the Indiana General Assembly, which could take further action.

Consumer Alert: Fire Pit Tables, Portable Generators Pose Burn And Impact Injury Risk

Indiana Attorney General Todd Rokita is alerting Hoosiers of important consumer protection concerns for products recalled in September. This is the time to take advantage of opportunities available for those who purchased these recalled items.

"The weather is turning cooler, but some of your products could be heating up without your knowledge," Rokita said. "You shouldn't have to worry if keeping your family warm while you're outdoors during the fall months could be a fire risk. This is the time to act. Don't let a flawed product put your family in danger. Stop using recalled items immediately and pursue resolution from the manufacturer."

the ex-employee discount code. One consumer reported: "As you add more things from the website to your cart, the shipping cost increases disproportionately..."

However, this still seems like a 'deal' because you are getting a 100% discount on (faux) jewelry that costs \$100-200." However, that's not the only warning sign. The consumer added, "There is no cancellation mechanism on their website/order confirmation email, no social media, no address, and no phone number. You can only contact them via an email address."

If you fall for this scam, you won't receive the high-quality jewelry you thought you ordered. You may get cheaply made knockoffs - or nothing at all. Also, you'll be out any money you spent on "shipping" too.

The current version

of this scam involves a jewelry store, but watch out for other variations as scammers change their schemes to avoid detection. This con would work with high-cost items like electronics or designer handbags.

How to avoid online shopping scams

Don't fall for deals that are too good to be true. Scammers love to draw people in with this bait. If a deal seems extraordinarily good, stay skeptical. Research the company thoroughly before you buy.

Only shop with reputable companies. It's always best to shop with companies you already know and trust. That said, if you come across an appealing item from an unfamiliar business, it's especially important to do research. Look up the company's website, physical address, and contact information. Read

reviews from customers on third-party websites and review comments left on their social media pages, too. You can even search the company name and the word "scam" just to be safe.

Always make payments with your credit card. When shopping online, use your credit card to pay. Controlling fraudulent charges (and possibly getting your money back) will be much easier with this payment method.

stop when the person reaches full retirement age, at which point the beneficiary is automatically switched to regular SS retirement, and after which their benefits are paid from the regular "OASI" Trust Fund.

"Regular" Social Security retirement benefits, spousal benefits, dependent benefits, and survivor benefits are paid from Social Security's Old Age and Survivors Insurance (OASI) Trust Fund, which receives most (5.3%) of the 6.2% FICA Social Security tax withheld from the paychecks of American workers. As

of the end of 2022, the OASI Trust Fund held about \$2.7 trillion in interest bearing government bonds. Neither SSI or SSDI affect this "regular" OASI Trust Fund - only true SS retirement benefits and benefits for dependents of the retiree are paid from the OASI Trust Fund (As an aside, Social Security reform is needed to prevent the OASI Trust Fund from being fully depleted in 2033).

To answer your last questions, the Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) Trust Fund was established in 1956, after which SSDI benefit pay-

ments to eligible disabled American workers began. Federal "Supplemental Security Income" (SSI) assistance was codified into law in 1974. And, as you likely know, Social Security retirement, spousal and dependent benefits were enacted in the 1930s, before the first monthly Social Security check was mailed in January 1940. The impetus behind these programs? Avoiding poverty for the neediest among us. Without these programs, at least 22 million more Americans would be living below the poverty line.

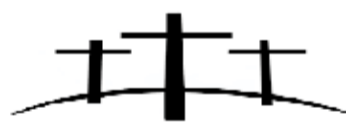

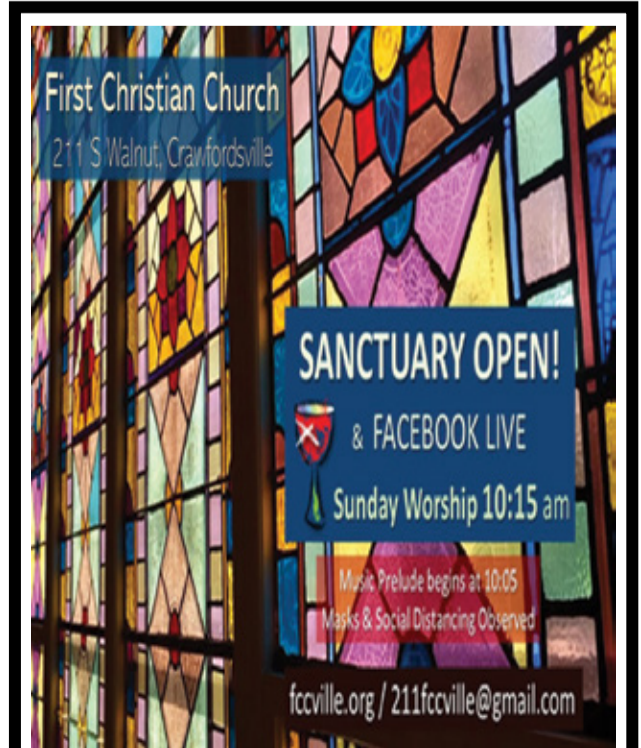
